There were no incompatibilities or conflicts between the land use plans of local governments identified during the development of the service delivery strategy. Bulloch Commy and the towns of Brooklet, Portal, and Register prepared and adopted a joint land use plan in 1993 and updated the plan in 1998. While the City of Statesboro currently has a separate land use plan, no incompatibilities or conflicts were found between the city's plan and the county's.

3. Summarize the process that will be used to resolve disputes when a county disagrees with the proposed land use classification(s) for areas to be annexed into a city. If the conflict resolution process will vary for different cities in the county, summarize each process.

In June, 1998, the county and each city adopted the same process in the Agreement to Resolve Land Use Classification Disputes. To summarize, 1) city will notify county of proposed annexation and information on the property including proposed zoning; 2) county will respond within 45 days to the city if there is any objection (or the county loses its right to object); 3) if the county has no objection the city can proceed with annexation; 4) if the county notifies the city that it has a bona fide objection, the city has 10 days to respond by a) agreeing to the county's stipulations and resolving the objection, b) agreeing with the county and stopping the annexation, c) disagreeing that the objections are bona fide and notifying the county that the city will seek a declaratory judgement, d) meeting with the county to mitigate the issue and resolve the county's objection(s), or e) initiating a mediation process (the county will agree on a mediator and share any mediation costs); 5) if no resolution of the county's bona fide objections results from the mediation, the city will not proceed with annexation; 6) if the city and county reach agreement, they will draft an annexation agreement for execution by the city and county governments.

4. What policies, procedures, and/or processes have been established by local governments (and water and sewer authorities) to ensure that new extraterritorial water and sewer service will be consistent with all applicable land use plans and ordinances?

In an effort to insure that extraterritorial water and service extensions or improvements are consistent with all applicable land use plans and ordinances, the respective member governments of Bulloch County, by adopting the service delivery agreement, also agree to establish the following process for the provision of extraterritorial water and sewer services.

1) Prior to initiating the provision of water and sewer services outside the boundaries of that respective local government, the City will notify the County government of the services to be provided, the proposed service area, and the anticipated impact on the future land use classification. The notification will include, at a minimum, information on location of property, size of the proposed service area, proposed purpose of the extension (i.e., proposed change in land use), and the current and future land use classification. For the purposes of official notification of the county as required by this agreement, notification of the county shall be achieved by delivery of the required information to the County Manager. Concurrent with the notification to the County Manager, the city will forward the proposed extraterritorial extension data required above to the county Zoning Administrator for review. Within 10 working days following receipt of the above information, the County will forward to the City a statement either: (a) indicating that the County has no objection to the proposed extraterritorial water or sewer service and its consistency with the land use plan and all applicable ordinances; or (b) describing its bona fide objection(s)
