Introduction

Purpose

The comprehensive planning process, at its inception and culmination, is a vision for the future. The ultimate aim of the process is to develop a strong community. In order to achieve that objective, a meaningful comprehensive planning process must solicit and integrate the input of community citizens, government officials, and staff. The result will be a well-balanced comprehensive plan addressing the issues of today, the opportunities of tomorrow, and outlining the steps necessary to bring about positive change over the next twenty (20) years. The Clay County Joint Community Participation Program was designed with these goals in mind. The intent of the Clay County Joint Community Participation, open dialogue and communication as possible; seeking to build consensus among Clay County residents that will result in better government decisions and greater community agreement with those decisions.

State Comprehensive Planning Requirements

Clay County, the Town of Bluffton, and the City of Fort Gaines are required by state law to complete their Comprehensive Plan Update by June 30, 2008. The Joint Comprehensive Plan will be prepared in accordance with the Basic Planning Level Local Planning Requirements from the Georgia Department of Community Affairs (DCA), effective May 1, 2005.

Requirements for Creating a Successful Comprehensive Plan

Successful communities create a vision, agree upon a course of action to achieve the vision, and take the steps necessary to implement the vision.

The major challenge in developing a successful plan and thus a successful community for Clay County, the Town of Bluffton, and the City of Fort Gaines is convincing the citizens that the Joint Comprehensive Plan belongs to each and every resident and that broad-based public participation is essential to an effective planning process. Only a give and take process seeking local opinion and knowledge on planning issues can insure that the finished plan represents a balance of community interests. This will create community consensus (a Vision) regarding future development policies and practices.

Citizen Notification

Various media will be used to get citizens involved in the planning process. Civic leaders and civic groups as well as churches will be contacted to assist in getting the word out regarding citizen involvement opportunities. Press releases, posters, announcements at public meetings and flyers attached to utility bills will be used to notify the public about upcoming meetings and to generate public interest.

Citizen Involvement Strategy

Public Hearings

The State of Georgia rules and regulations for Local Comprehensive Planning require that two (2) public hearings be held in association with the development of a Comprehensive Plan. The first public hearing will be held to inform the public that the planning process is underway and to go over the draft Community Assessment and Public Participation Program. The public hearing is scheduled for February 1, 2007 at the Clay County Elementary School. The public hearing attendees will be briefed on the plan's timeline (Kick-Off / Vision Meeting, Final Review Meeting and the Final Public Hearing Meeting) and how they can help the planning process. Attendees will also be given an opportunity to comment on the Public Participation Plan and Community Assessment.

Kick- Off Meeting

A meeting to establish a general Vision for Clay County is scheduled for March 8, 2007 at 6:30 p.m. at the Clay County Senior Center. Attendees will be briefed on what a Vision Statement is, how to create a good Vision Statement and given examples. Once the review is over facilitators will lead participants through a vision creation process. The meeting has three (3) primary goals:

- 1. Verify Community Issues and Identify any Changes
- 2. Create a Vision
- 3. Identify Strategies for Success

In order to achieve the above goals, a S.W.O.T. Analysis conducted June – September, 2006 will be verified and amended, Issues and Opportunities over the planning period will be discussed, quality of life issues reviewed, major steps necessary to achieve desired results discussed and what measures can be taken to identify future success.

Future Development / Character Area Map Design Meeting

The Future Development / Character Area Map Design Meetings are tentatively scheduled for 2nd Thursday of every month, April – June, 2007 at the Clay County Elementary School. The meetings will start with a review of items developed during the previous meetings. On April 12, 2007 the citizen group will work on the Character Area Maps, define and create a vision for each character area. On May 10, 2007, the citizen group will identify development strategies and implementation tools. On June 14, 2007, the citizen group will review elements of the Community Agenda relating to character areas.

Final Review Meeting

A Final Review Meeting is tentatively scheduled for August, 2007 for two (2) hours at the Clay County Elementary School. The purpose of the meeting will be to allow citizens to review and comment on the Community Agenda. All draft documents and

maps will be available for review. Staff will be positioned at various stations to take comments. Displays, comment cards, handouts, and other information materials will be distributed. Formal written comments, collected at the conclusion of the meeting, will be summarized and responded to in a timely manner.

Adoption Process

The draft Community Agenda will be presented during regularly scheduled meetings of the Bluffton Town Council, Clay County Board of Commissioners, and Fort Gaines City Council before transmittal to the Lower Chattahoochee Regional Development Center (RDC) for regional and state review. After the RDC and the Georgia Department of Community Affairs review the Community Agenda, the final draft will be presented to the Bluffton Town Council, Clay County Board of Commissioners, and Fort Gaines City Council at regularly scheduled meetings. Public comment will be received at those hearings.
