#4. In the prior agreement for service delivery area, the City of Jasper provided fire protection for its incorporated boundaries as well as an area in the unincorporated area of Pickens County. The City of Jasper will continue to provide fire protection in its incorporated boundaries as well as unincorporated areas shown in the City's service delivery area map as in the previous strategy in exchange for negotiated in-kind service based on fire service call volume outside the city limits. In-kind service will be determined with an annual balance sheet, if so desired, detailing project assistance by Pickens County within the City of Jasper to offset cost of city fire service outside the Jasper City limits. Pickens County will continue to provide fire protection to all other unincorporated areas of the county outside the Jasper service delivery area, and will continue to provide fire protection for the Town of Talking Rock. The City of Nelson will continue to be protected by the Cherokee fire system. Big Canoe and Bent Tree (private gated communities) will continue to have their own fire protection.
