Introduction

The City of Cornelia, Georgia has completed this Comprehensive Plan Five-Year Update in compliance with the requirements of Chapter 110-12-1, Standards and Procedures for Local Comprehensive Planning, effective January 1, 2013. The Update includes a Report of Accomplishments for the Short Term Work Program 2008 – 2013, and an updated Community Work Program for the period of 2013 – 2018.

The City held two public hearings to accept public input on the Update. These hearings were held on January 24, 2013 and in association with the regularly scheduled City of Cornelia Council meeting on May 7, 2013. Documentation regarding public outreach is included in the Appendix.

Report of Accomplishments

The Report of Accomplishments is an assessment of the City's existing Community Work Program (CWP). This requirement gives the City the opportunity to evaluate how many of the tasks previously defined have been implemented and eliminate activities that are no longer desirable or feasible for the City to pursue. At a minimum, the Report of Accomplishments must identify the current status of each activity in the previous Community Work Program. At a minimum, local governments must indicate activities that:

- Have been completed;
- Are currently underway (including a projected completion date);
- Have been postponed (explaining why and when it will be resumed); or
- Have not been accomplished and are no longer activities the local government intends to undertake (explaining why).

Community Work Program (CWP)

The Georgia Department of Community Affairs (DCA) requires a CWP be developed and implemented by the City as detailed in Chapter 110-12-1, Standards and Procedures for Local Comprehensive Planning, effective January 1, 2013. This element of the comprehensive plan lays out the specific activities the community plans to undertake during the next five years to address the priority Needs and Opportunities and to achieve portions of the Community Goals. This includes any activities, initiatives, programs, ordinances, administrative systems (such as site plan review, design review, etc.) to be put in place to implement the plan. The DCA requires the CWP to be submitted every five years (minimum), to provide an implementation guide to the City. The Community Work Program must include the following information for each listed activity:

- Brief description of the activity;
- Legal authorization for the activity, if applicable;
- Timeframe for initiating and completing the activity;
- Responsible party for implementing the activity;
- Estimated cost (if any) of implementing the activity; and
- Funding source(s), if applicable.
