3. What policies, procedures and/or processes have been established by local governments (and water and sewer authorities) to ensure that new extraterritorial water and sewer service will be consistent with all applicable land use plans and ordinances? To date expansion of those services outside city limits is very limited. The only city that has public sewer service is the City of Talbotton and cost factors exclude the expansion of that service into the unincorporated area of Talbot County. The City of Woodland operates a limited sewage treatment plant that only serves approximately 20 Housing Authority owned apartments. The City of Woodland does not have the money to increase the plant capacity. Talbot County and the municipal service water providers in Talbot County all work together to avoid water/sewer service duplication. The municipalities providing water services must get approval from Talbot County to extend water service into the unincorporated area. In addition, Talbot County and the cities of Geneva, Junction City, Talbotton, and Woodland use their Comprehensive Plan Future Land Use Map and Potential Areas of Development Map to identify areas where land use types could change outside of each cities jurisdiction. Each jurisdiction assigned the appropriate future land use in an effort to ensure that service extensions will match future land use plans.
