**New amenities coming to Alexander Park**

A new dog park, picnic facilities, a playground, and more will be added to Gwinnett's 132-acre Alexander Park on Old Snellville Highway south of Lawrenceville.

The project includes a new entrance from Scenic Highway 325 additional parking spaces, a pavilion, a playground, new trail connections, a restroom building, and a picnic shelter. A two-acre dog park will feature a separate area for small dogs. Funding will come from the 2014 and 2017 SPLOST programs approved by voters.

Future plans for the park include the creation of a nature preserve on about 40 acres of land the County purchased last year. A timeline for that project has not yet been established.

**PUBLIC SAFETY**

**Remember your pet in a disaster**

For most of us, our pets are like family. They keep us company, help keep us fit, and help keep us sane. But in an emergency, pets are often not allowed to accompany their families to a shelter. It's good to have a plan for your four-legged friends for when you're caught in a disaster or even unexpectedly called out of town. Consider creating a go-bag of essential items for your pet as well.

- Coordinate with a trusted friend or neighbor to evacuate or care for your pet if you're not around
- Ensure your pet is microchipped
- Bag at least three days of food in an airtight, waterproof container
- Pack medicines and other important documents
- Remember pet litter and a litter box if appropriate
- Bring a picture of you and your pet together in case you become separated. Add species, breed, age, sex, color, and distinguishing characteristics
- Pack familiar items, such as treats, toys, and bedding
- Locate boarding facilities or animal hospitals near your evacuation shelter

**PROTECTING OUR RESOURCES**



**Make a rain barrel and save water, cash**

Irrigation accounts for nearly half of the average homeowner's water use during the summer. If you are looking for ways to reduce your water usage, don't use drinking water to irrigate your plants; catch water in a rain barrel and use that instead!

Rain barrels are easy to install and maintain. Many come already set up from a store, or you can purchase a kit and barrel to construct your own. Gwinnett Water Resources will even help you make one at our rain barrel workshops. Install your barrel next to a gutter downspout and near plants that need to be watered regularly. To maintain the barrel, paint it to block the sun. This can be a simple coat of primer, or you can turn it into an art project. Drain and clean the barrel with a small amount of bleach once a year. During the winter, you may want to disconnect the rain barrel or at least drain it soon after it fills to prevent freezing.

Once your rain barrel is set up, it is ready to provide free, renewable rainwater for irrigating your lawn or garden. Using a rain barrel to irrigate helps improve water quality in streams and lakes because it reduces stormwater runoff, which also helps protect stream banks from erosion and can reduce localized flooding. Since treated, potable water comes out of your garden hose, using a rain barrel helps conserve our main source of drinking water – Lake Lanier.

## LA PROTECCIÓN DE NUESTROS RECURSOS

### Haga su propio barril para aguas pluviales y ahorre agua, dinero en efectivo

El riego representa casi la mitad del consumo promedio de agua de un propietario durante el verano. Si está buscando maneras de reducir el consumo de agua, no use agua potable para regar las plantas; junte agua de lluvia en un barril y use esa agua para regar.

Los barriles para aguas pluviales son fáciles de instalar y mantener. Muchos ya vienen amados desde la tienda o bien, puede comprar un kit y un barril para hacer uno. El Departamento de Recursos Hídricos de Gwinnett puede incluso ayudarlo a hacer uno en nuestros talleres de barril para aguas pluviales. Instale el barril al lado de un bajante pluvial en forma de canaleta y cerca de plantas que se deban regar regularmente. Pinte el barril para conservarlo y bloquear el sol. Puede ser una capa simple de imprimador, o puede convertirlo en un proyecto de arte. Drene y limpie el barril con una pequeña cantidad de lejía una vez al año. Durante el invierno, posiblemente desee desconectar el barril para aguas pluviales o, al menos, drenarlo no bien se llene para evitar el congelamiento.

Una vez instalado su barril para aguas pluviales, está listo para ofrecer agua de lluvia renovable y sin costo para regar el césped o el jardín. Usar un barril para aguas pluviales para el riego ayuda a mejorar la calidad del agua en arroyos y lagos dado que reduce las escorrentías de las aguas pluviales, que también ayuda a proteger los bancos de los arroyos de la erosión y permite reducir las inundaciones localizadas. Dado que de la manguera del jardín sale agua tratada y potable, usar un barril para aguas pluviales ayuda a conservar nuestro recurso principal de agua potable, Lake Lanier.

## SPLOST

### Nuevos servicios para Alexander Park

Un nuevo parque para perros, un área para los días de campo, un patio de juegos y más espacios se agregarán al parque Alexander Park de 132 acres de Gwinnett en Old Snellville Highway, sur de Lawrenceville.

El proyecto incluye una nueva entrada desde Scenic Highway, 325 lugares de estacionamiento adicionales, un pabellón, un patio de juegos, nuevas conexiones de tren, una edificación de baños y un refugio para pasar un día de campo. El parque para perros de dos acres contará con un área separada para perros pequeños. La financiación provendrá de los programas SPLOST 2014 y 2017 aprobados por los votantes.

Los planes futuros para el parque incluyen la creación de una reserva natural en aproximadamente 40 acres de tierra que el condado compró el año pasado. Aún no se ha definido un cronograma para ese proyecto.

### Acuérdese de su mascota en un desastre

La mayoría de nosotros consideramos a las mascotas parte de la familia. Nos hacen compañía, nos ayudan a mantenernos en forma y en nuestro sano juicio. Pero en caso de una emergencia, suele no estar permitido que las mascotas acompañen a sus familias a un refugio. Es bueno tener un plan para nuestros amigos de cuatro patas cuando uno queda atrapado por un desastre o cuando debe abandonar la ciudad de forma imprevista. Considere la posibilidad de amarrar también un bolso de viaje con los objetos esenciales para su mascota.

- Coordine con un amigo o vecino de confianza para evacuar o cuidar a su mascota si usted no está cerca.
- Asegúrese de que su mascota tenga un microchip.
- Coloque alimento para, al menos, tres días en un recipiente hermético e impermeable.
- Empaque medicamentos y otros documentos importantes.
- Recuerde empacar granulado higiénico para mascotas y una caja para granulado, si corresponde.
- Tenga consigo una fotografía de usted con su mascota en caso de que se deban separar. Incluya la especie, raza, edad, sexo, color y las características distintivas.
- Empaque objetos familiares, como golosinas, juguetes y su cucha.
- Localice internados u hospitales para animales en el área cerca de su
- refugio de evacuación.

## Chairman Nash delivers 2018 State of the County Address

Almost two centuries of Gwinnett County's rich history provided the backdrop for Board of Commissioners Chairman Charlotte Nash's 2018 State of the County speech Tuesday to a crowd of about 800 at the Infinite Energy Center.

*"Two hundred years after our founding, we remain a community of pioneers, with many of our residents having come from across the U.S. and from around the globe, seeking opportunity and prosperity," she said.*

With a projected population of more than 1.5 million in 2040, Nash said expanded transportation options must include transit. She said she hopes the state legislature will pass a bill that balances regional oversight and local control.

**SPLOST: New parking deck heralds courthouse addition project**

A new parking deck at Constitution Boulevard and Nash Street is the first phase of a courthouse expansion at the Gwinnett Justice and Administration Center in Lawrenceville.

The project begins with part of the deck constructed with 850 spaces for employees and visitors to the facility. After this phase is finished by the end of the year, the existing parking deck on Nash Street will be demolished. Then, a new 180,000-square-foot courthouse addition will be built where the old deck once stood, and the remaining portion of the new deck will be built with about 700 spaces.

The new parking structure, which will also include elevators, will result in four stories of covered parking and about 1,500 parking spaces. A covered pedestrian walkway will tie the deck to the new courthouse addition. The expansion project will be funded with 2009 SPLOST revenue.

**Beware of phone scams**

Scammers are posing as law enforcement officials or IRS agents to trick people into giving them money with prepaid debit cards.

Con artists are calling people claiming to be from the Gwinnett County Police Department, the Gwinnett County Sheriff's Office, or the IRS.

The official-sounding caller will tell the victim that there are outstanding fines, active warrants for their arrest, or unpaid taxes, and that to avoid going to jail, the victim must drive to a local grocery or convenience store, load a specific sum of money on a prepaid debit card, such as Green Dot, and then give the access codes to the caller. Once the scammer has the card's PIN number, the money is gone.

Law enforcement and government agencies will never demand payment over the phone by a prepaid debit card.

**Protect the earth from home toxic waste**

Many of the same chemicals that make household products effective are harmful when released into the environment. If misused or disposed of improperly, many commonly used products have the potential to become household hazardous waste.

Household hazardous waste includes paints, oils, batteries, and pesticides. Improper disposal of these types of products includes pouring them on the ground, down the drain, into a storm drain, or directly into a waterway.

Some of these items might be kept under the sink or in the garage for extended periods of time, and as their containers age, the risk of leakage increases. Once exposed to the environment, toxins could soak into the ground or be washed down a storm drain, which could lead to pollution in our lakes and streams.

Follow these tips to prevent water pollution:

- Only buy the amount you need for a project
- Many liquid home products can be solidified using cat litter, saw dust, and other absorbent materials, and placed in the trash
- Many local retailers and organizations offer recycling programs and will accept home products for disposal
- Consult the product label for disposal guidance

### La presidente Nash pronuncia el Discurso del Estado del Condado de 2018

La eliminación inadecuada de estos tipos de productos incluye verterlos en el suelo, el resumidero, en un desagüe pluvial o directamente en una vía navegable. Es posible que los productos de desecho potencialmente peligrosos tengan etiquetas que digan "precaución", "peligro" o "veneno".

Algunos de estos artículos pueden guardarse en el bajo mesada o en el garaje por largos períodos y, a medida que los envases envejecen, aumenta el riesgo de fuga. Una vez liberados al medioambiente, las toxinas podrían penetrar en el suelo o ser arrastradas por un desagüe pluvial, lo cual podría generar contaminación en nuestros lagos y arroyos.

Para evitar la contaminación del agua, siga las sugerencias a continuación:

- Compre solo la cantidad de producto que necesita.
- Muchos productos líquidos para el hogar pueden solidificarse con arena para gatos, aserrín y otros materiales absorbentes antes de tirarlos a la basura.
- Muchas tiendas minoristas y organizaciones locales ofrecen programas de reciclaje y aceptarán eliminar sus productos para el hogar.

### **SPLOST: La nueva playa de estacionamiento anuncia el proyecto de ampliación del palacio de justicia**

La nueva playa de estacionamiento en Constitution Boulevard y Nash Street constituye la primera etapa de un proyecto de ampliación del palacio de justicia en el centro Gwinnett Justice and Administration Center, en Lawrenceville.

El proyecto comienza con una parte de la playa que incluye 850 espacios para empleados y visitantes del recinto. Una vez que se termine esta etapa antes de fin de año, la playa de estacionamiento existente en Nash Street se demolerá. Luego, se construirá la ampliación del palacio de justicia nuevo, la cual tendrá una extensión de 180,000 pies cuadrados, donde estaba la antigua playa; la parte restante de la playa nueva tendrá aproximadamente 700 espacios.

Una vez finalizada la obra, el edificio de estacionamiento nuevo, que también incluirá ascensores, tendrá cuatro pisos cubiertos y alrededor de 1,500 espacios de estacionamiento. Una pasarela peatonal techada unirá la playa con la ampliación del palacio de justicia. El proyecto de ampliación se financiará con los ingresos de impuestos SPLOST de 2009.



## SEGURIDAD PÚBLICA

### **Cuidado con las estafas telefónicas**

Los estafadores se hacen pasar por agentes de las fuerzas armadas o funcionarios del Servicio de Impuestos Internos (IRS) para engañar a las personas, a fin de que les den dinero a través de tarjetas de débito prepagas. Los estafadores llaman a las personas y se hacen pasar por agentes del Departamento de Policía del Condado de Gwinnett o de la Oficina del Sheriff del Condado de Gwinnett, o funcionarios del IRS. En la supuesta llamada oficial, se le dice a la víctima que hay multas pendientes, órdenes de arresto activas o impuestos impagos y que para evitar ir a la cárcel, la víctima debe conducir a una tienda o supermercado local, cargar una suma específica de dinero en una tarjeta de débito prepaga, como Green Dot y, luego, proporcionarle los códigos de acceso a la persona que llama.

Una vez que el estafador tiene el número PIN de la tarjeta, el dinero desaparece y no hay forma de recuperarlo. Tenga en cuenta que las agencias del orden público y del gobierno nunca exigen un pago por teléfono mediante una tarjeta de débito prepaga.

## Gwinnett trails master plan foresees network of pathways

A recently unveiled draft of the Gwinnett Countywide Trails Master Plan envisions a network of County trails tying in with trails by other jurisdictions to create an interconnected web of bike and pedestrian pathways for recreation, commuting, or running errands.

As part of the 320-mile network of trails, the study proposes nine "Signature Trails," regionally significant trails with amenities, connectivity between destinations, and other defining features. Some, such as the Sugar Hill Greenway, are being built by cities. Some will stretch across multiple cities. The long-term goal, which may take decades to implement depending on funding, will be realized incrementally.

Many of the Signature Trails were included in the plan's Core Trail Network, a series of trails contemplated by 2040. The plan recommended some quick projects, such as the Western Gwinnett Bikeway, a proposed 18-mile trail located along Peachtree Industrial Boulevard from Suwanee to Peachtree Corners.

It states the value assessed on your property as of January 1. You can appeal the stated value within 45 days from the date of your notice. ### Commissioners approve contract for new playgrounds at two County parks

Two Gwinnett County parks will soon get new playground equipment with improved handicap-accessibility under a SPLOST-funded \$750,000 contract.

Contractors will replace playground equipment and surfaces at George Pierce Park in Suwanee and Mountain Park in Lilburn. The playground at George Pierce Park will feature a net-climbing tower with flexible platforms, a tightrope, a multi-person spinner, and a small climbing dome. An area for toddlers includes a new slide and climber.

Mountain Park will have a new wheelchair-accessible sensory tunnel, plus ramps, a variety of slides, climbers, activity panels, and a tower. An area for tots includes a two-story playhouse and a sand table.

Spring cleaning around the house is a good time to change the battery in your smoke alarms, especially if you forgot to change the battery at daylight saving time. A smoke alarm is the first line of defense when it comes to surviving a home fire by giving added time to escape. You may have less than two minutes to escape a home fire.

A constant loud "beeping" sound from the alarm indicates smoke or fire in the home. An intermittent "chirp" indicates the battery needs to be changed.

Test the alarm monthly and replace all smoke alarms after 10 years. And be sure to have an escape plan with two ways out and clear pathways to exits. ## PROTECTING OUR RESOURCES



### Protect our rivers and streams: Only rain in the drain

Everything that goes in the storm drain could potentially end up in our rivers and streams.

The Department of Water Resources manages a stormwater drainage system designed to move water and control flooding by taking in rainwater from multiple locations and discharging it directly to the nearest body of water. With Gwinnett averaging 50 inches of rain a year, the stormwater drainage system manages a lot of water!

The stormwater system is made up of storm drains, gutters, and ditches that channel stormwater runoff to local rivers, streams, and lakes. What it doesn't do is filter out litter and pollution from our streets, parking lots, or yards. These pollutants could include things like lawn care products and yard clippings, pet waste, automotive fluids, and paint.

To help prevent this type of pollution:

- Don't litter
- Never dump anything down storm drains
- Don't blow yard trimmings into the street or down the drain
- Use lawn care products sparingly, and sweep the excess from sidewalks and driveways back onto your lawn

The Gwinnett County *Illicit Discharge and Illegal Connection Ordinance* prohibits the discharge of anything other than stormwater into any part of the stormwater drainage system. To report illegal discharges down a storm drain, please call the Gwinnett County Department of Water Resources at 678.376.7000.

### El Plan Maestro de Vías de Gwinnett prevé una red de caminos

Un borrador revelado recientemente del Plan Maestro de Senderos del Condado de Gwinnett proyecta una red de senderos que conectan los del condado con los de otras jurisdicciones para crear una red interconectada de caminos para ciclistas y peatones con fines de recreación, para desplazarse al trabajo o para hacer recados.

Como parte de una red de senderos de 320 millas, el estudio propone nueve «Senderos de Autor», senderos significativos a nivel regional con instalaciones, conectividad entre los destinos y otras características distintivas. Algunos, como Sugar Hill Greenway, están siendo construidos por las ciudades. Algunos se extenderán a lo largo de varias ciudades. El objetivo a largo plazo, cuya implementación tomará décadas según la financiación, se llevará a cabo de manera gradual.

### Protejamos nuestros ríos y arroyos: Solo agua en el desagüe

Todo lo que ingresa en el desagüe pluvial puede terminar en nuestros ríos y arroyos.

El Departamento de Recursos Hídricos controla un sistema de desagüe pluvial diseñado para trasladar el agua y controlar las inundaciones recolectando el agua pluvial de varias localidades y descargándola directamente en la masa de agua más cercana. Con un promedio de 50 pulgadas de precipitaciones al año en Gwinnett, el sistema de desagüe pluvial controla una gran cantidad de agua.

El sistema de desagüe pluvial está conformado por desagües, alcantarillas y acequias que dirigen el agua pluvial hacia ríos, arroyos y lagos locales. Lo que no hace es filtrar los residuos y la contaminación de las calles, los estacionamientos o los jardines. Estos contaminantes pueden incluir productos para el cuidado del césped y recortes de césped, residuos de mascotas, fluidos automotrices y pintura.

Para ayudar a prevenir este tipo de contaminación:

- No arroje basura.
- Nunca arroje nada en los desagües pluviales.
- No coloque los recortes de césped en la calle o en el desagüe.
- Utilice los productos de cuidado para el césped con moderación, retire el exceso de las aceras y las calles, y colóquelo nuevamente en su césped.

La Ordenanza de Vertido Ilícito y Conexión Ilegal del Condado de Gwinnett prohíbe el vertido de todo lo que no sea agua pluvial dentro de cualquier parte del sistema de desagüe pluvial. ## SPLOST

Es posible que tenga menos de dos minutos para escapar de un incendio doméstico.

Todo hogar debería contar con alarmas contra incendios en funcionamiento en cada planta, en el corredor fuera del área de descanso y en cada una de las habitaciones. Nunca ignore el sonido de la alarma contra incendios. Un pitido fuerte y constante de la alarma contra incendios indica humo o fuego dentro en el hogar. Un chirrido intermitente indica que se debe cambiar la batería.

Compruebe el funcionamiento de la alarma todos los meses y reemplace todas las alarmas contra incendios cada 10 años. Y asegúrese de tener un plan de escape con dos salidas y que los caminos hacia las salidas estén despejados. ## County Commission approves contract to expand transit, sets voter referendum date

The Gwinnett County Board of Commissioners on Wednesday approved a contract with the Metropolitan Atlanta Rapid Transit Authority to operate and expand Gwinnett's transit system in accordance with the recently approved Connect Gwinnett Transit Development Plan.



The board also passed a motion putting the contract on the ballot in a March 19, 2019, special election for voter consideration.

Voters in March 2019 will be asked to say yes or no to the contract negotiated with the Authority. As dictated by state law, the ballot question shall read: "Gwinnett County has executed a contract for the provision of transit services, dated as of August 2, 2018. Shall this contract be approved? YES \_\_\_ NO \_\_\_."

If voters approve the contract, a 1 percent sales tax then would be assessed starting July 1, 2019, to help cover the cost of operations, improvements, and equipment. The sales tax proceeds combined with federal funds and fare box collections will fund the transit expansion. Bonds are also allowed and can help spread the costs for large capital projects. The bond debt would be repaid over time with proceeds from the transit sales tax.

Under the contract, future transit projects would follow the Connect Gwinnett Transit Development Plan, which took into account input from residents, businesses, a technical committee of experts, stakeholders, planners, and others. The transit plan was approved by the Board of Commissioners on July 17 of this year.

#### **Bond rating agencies give Gwinnett County top grades for management, fiscal policies**

All three bond rating agencies have once again given Gwinnett County a AAA/Aaa bond rating, the highest possible, placing Gwinnett in the top 2 percent of counties in the nation for fiscal soundness. This marks the 21<sup>st</sup> consecutive year Gwinnett has held this distinction.

The stellar rating allows the County to issue or refinance bonds at favorable rates, which reduces the interest paid by taxpayers.

Gwinnett County is one of fewer than 50 counties of approximately 3,000 counties nationwide to have a Triple AAA bond rating. The latest rating came after the County's financial management practices and financial results went through intense review by analysts from S&P Global, Moody's Investors Service, and Fitch Ratings.

In determining a government's ratings, the rating agencies do a thorough review of a government's finances, operations, and policies. The rating review came as the County, through its Development Authority, seeks to go to the bond market to issue \$96.1 million in bonds to fund construction at the Infinite Energy Center, including expansion of the conference center, a new parking deck, and other improvements on the campus. This is the first construction bond issue by Gwinnett County in nearly 10 years.

#### **School starts Monday so don't pass stopped buses and watch for kids at bus stops**





Gwinnett County Public Schools kicks off the 2018-2019 school year on Monday, **August 6**, and motorists are advised to give GCPS buses plenty of room and time to pick up and drop off students before and after school.

Watch for amber and red flashing lights that indicate a stopped school bus. GCPS has placed cameras on about 300 buses to photograph drivers who illegally pass school buses. When the school bus amber or red lights are flashing, the system automatically detects vehicles passing the stopped school bus and records the violation. The violator will receive a citation in the mail.

In spring 2018, GCPS bus drivers conducted a one-day count of vehicles that passed stopped buses. They counted more than 2,000 violations in just one day.

#### Gwinnett to offer free disposal of household hazardous waste on August 11

Household hazardous waste materials can potentially contaminate water resources and pollute the air.

To help protect the environment and ease the burden on Gwinnett residents, the County's Fiscal and Solid Waste Management Division, Department of Water Resources, and Gwinnett Clean & Beautiful are partnering to host the County's first Household Hazardous Waste Recycling Event on **August 11**.



Residents can drop off five containers each of household hazardous waste for free. The event is limited to Gwinnett residents and proof of residency may be required. Materials accepted at the event include cleaners, batteries, fluorescent light bulbs and ballasts, lawn care products, oils, paints, and pesticides.

### Gwinnett County Bicentennial Moment - Graves at the Gwinnett Historic Courthouse

The bodies of eight militia soldiers killed fighting the Creek Indians are buried in the northwest corner of the Gwinnett Historic Courthouse.

In the early 19<sup>th</sup> century, white settlers in Gwinnett County had pushed the native Creek Indians across the Chattahoochee River. In 1836, the Creeks began attacking settlements along Georgia-Alabama border. Georgia Governor William Schley called for volunteers. Capt. Hammond Garmany and his mounted volunteers left Lawrenceville on May 26, 1836, and was mustered into the United States Army after arriving June 3. A few days later, 25 militiamen were dispatched to a fort about 40 miles south of Columbus.

On June 9, 1836, the militia heard shots and went to investigate. They found the Creek were about to attack. During the ensuing battle, Garmany was seriously wounded. Reinforcements arrived and attacked the Native Americans, killing 30 or more. Eight of Garmany's company were killed and four wounded. The dead Gwinnett County volunteers were buried with military honors in a common grave on February 17, 1837, in the northwest corner of the courthouse yard. In 1840, a marble monument was erected on the site.

A team of seven citizen volunteers served on Nash's budget review committee, hearing presentations from elected officials and department directors in late August. The group studied departmental business plans, budget needs, and revenue projections to make recommendations for the 2018 budget.



Commissioners held a public hearing on the proposed budget on Monday, December 4. Written comments are still welcome through an online comment form through **December 31**. The Board expects to adopt the 2018 budget on **January 2**.

### Gwinnett County Bicentennial Moment - A Step Back in Time



Gwinnett County was created on December 15, 1818, and named for Button Gwinnett, one of the three Georgia signers of the Declaration of Independence.

Formed from land ceded to the state of Georgia by the Cherokee and Creek Indians and a portion of Jackson County, Gwinnett was the 50th county to be organized in the state.

The first courthouse was located at the home of Elisha Winn, near what is now Dacula. Winn was also chosen to select the site for the first county seat and new courthouse. He paid \$200 for a 250-acre lot in the center of the county. Early courthouse business was held in a log cabin until a more permanent structure was built in 1824.

## Gwinnett beginning work on development, growth plan for 2040

The year 2040 may be more than two decades away, but Gwinnett County officials are already looking ahead at how the county should for the needs of that time.

County commissioners approved a \$955,120 contract with Pond and Company Tuesday to put together a 2040 Unified Plan for the county. The comprehensive plan is expected to look at several factors in Gwinnett's future, such as population growth and policies governing land uses and development.

As part of the planning process, Pond officials gather public input to decide how the county can best

plan for its future.

“The new comprehensive plan will guide our future land development and economic growth and, we hope, help build support for local government policies,” Gwinnett County Commission Chairwoman Charlotte Nash said in a statement.

The plan will look ahead to a key time in Gwinnett’s growth. Officials at the county and the Atlanta Regional Commission expect Gwinnett to become Georgia’s most populous county by 2040. The ARC projects the county will have about 1.35 million residents by then, if not more.

While there are still 23 years to go before 2040 arrives, state law requires county officials begin planning in advance and implement a new plan every 10 years. Several types of funding for a variety of improvement projects, including those that deal with infrastructure, are not available without a state-approved comprehensive plan in place, county officials said.

It’s been eight years since Gwinnett’s 2030 Unified Plan was adopted.

County officials said the new plan is expected to be finished about one year from now. They will then submit it to officials at the ARC for review.

Ultimately, county leaders said they have until February 2019 to get the new plan approved by the Georgia Department of Community Affairs.

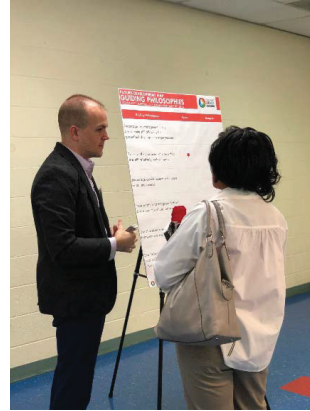

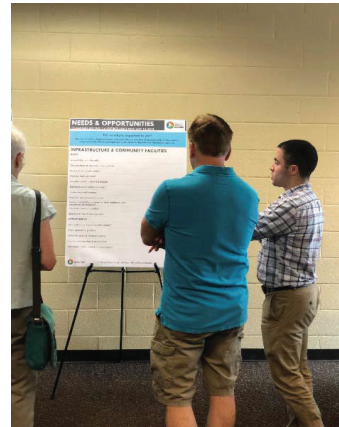

Figure 1. Round 1 Community Open House Locations

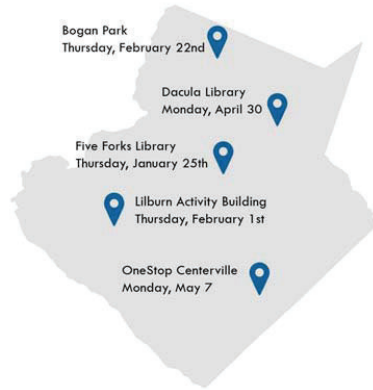
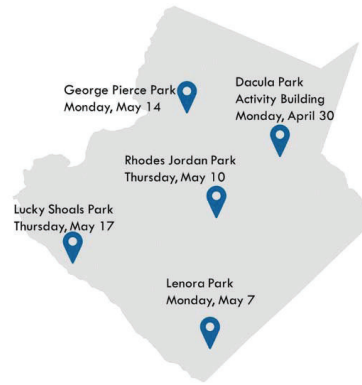


Figure 2. Round 2 Community Open House Locations

This station was geared at obtaining preliminary feedback on the county's vision, particularly in terms of the specific policies related to the previous plan's five elements. Using dots, participants were asked to read the policies from the 2030 unified plan and indicate whether each policy was:

- "Still Relevant" – Policy is still relevant today
- "No Longer Relevant" – Policy is no longer relevant today
- "Needs Refinement" – Policy is still relevant, but needs to be reexamined

**Table 4** below presents the results of the vision exercise, particularly in terms of how respondents agreed with the 2030 plan policies.

## Station 3. Big Ideas (Exercise #2)

In this station, participants were shown a list of needs and opportunities that were identified by the Unified Plan Planning Advisory Committee (PAC). They were asked to provide additional needs and/or opportunities that they felt were relevant today. Participants were also asked to place dots next to any needs or opportunities they agreed with. **Table 5 and Table 6** below shows the Top 10 Needs and Opportunities selected by attendees of the Round 1 and 2 Community Open Houses.

#### Station 4. Plan the Future (Exercise #3).

This station was comprised of two exercises, titled “Change & Preserve” and “Urban Scale”. In the “Change & Preserve” exercise, attendees were shown an aerial map of Gwinnett County, labeled with various landmarks and points of interest for context. Participants were asked to place green dots in areas where they believed the existing character of the county should be preserved, and red dots in areas where the existing character should change.

In the ‘Urban Scale’ exercise, participants were asked to provide further feedback on the areas in the county they identified during the “Change & Preserve” activity. Participants were first shown a diagram of the conservation to urban transect, a visual representation of land use and density at various scales. **Figure 3** below is of the transect. It is important to note that the scales reflected in the transect are simply a general representation of development and density.

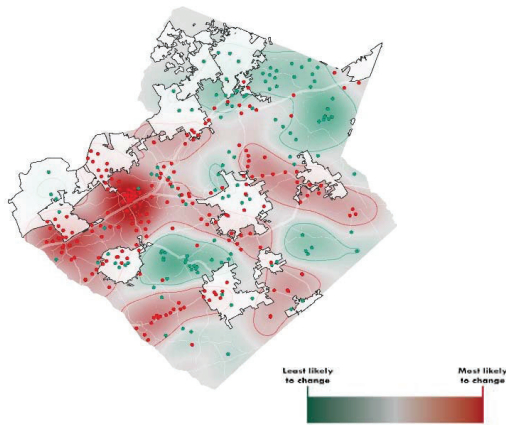
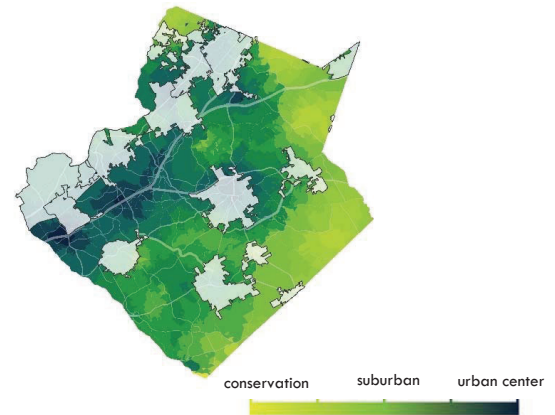


Figure 5. Composite Results of Urban Scale Exercise (Round 1)

Using dots associated with each level of development, participants were asked to indicate on a county aerial map the scale of development they thought was appropriate in certain areas. **Figure 4** and **Figure 5** below present maps of the aggregate results of the Change & Preserve and Urban Scale Exercises during the Round 1 Community Open Houses. The results of this exercise from the individual meetings is included in **Appendix B**.

Figure 4. Composite Results of Change & Preserve Exercise (Round 1)

Overall, strong preferences for change were noted in areas in the Western portion of the county, particularly along the I-85 corridor and near notable points of interest (i.e. Gwinnett Place Mall, Infiinte Energy Arena, etc.). Other notable corridors (US 78, SR 20) were also identified as areas with the most opportunity to change. This is in contrast to the northern portion of the county, where there was the least preference for change.

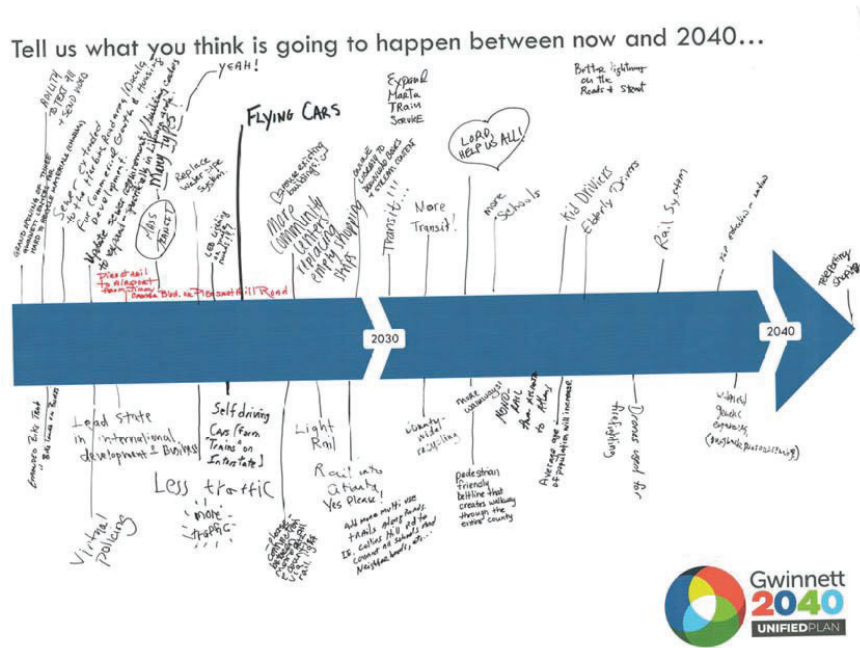


In terms of land use and density preferences, the results from the first round of meetings illustrate that denser development is desired in the Western portion of the county. Extreme eastern and Southern portions of the county are desired to be maintained as relatively low-density development. When these results are compared to those of the Change & Preserve exercise, some similarities are evident. The areas indicated as most likely to change were also areas identified as having the most dense level of development (i.e. urban scale). Alternatively, areas with strong preferences for conservation were also areas that received higher preference for a rural-type character.

### Timeline Exercise

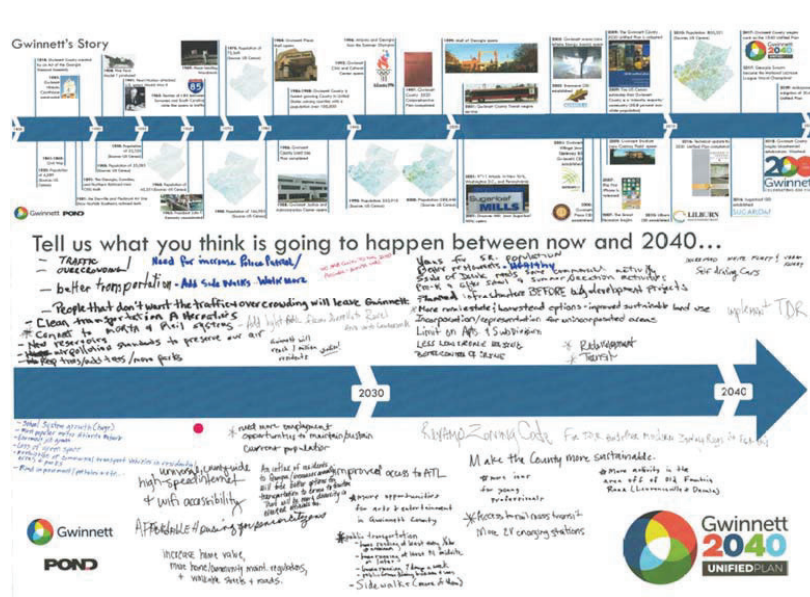
Figure 6. Round 1 Open House Timeline

As attendees entered or existed the meeting, they were encouraged to take a look at a timeline of the county's history, and provide thoughts on how they envision Gwinnett County in 2040. **Figure 6** and **Figure 7** below show the timelines from the Round 1 and Round 2 meetings.

## Round 2 Community Open Houses

Several of the stations and exercises during round 1 of community open houses (*i.e. What's a Unified Plan, Tell Us Your Vision, Plan the Future*) were also held during round 2 to gather as much feedback as possible. The following stations discussed relate to the new exercises unique to this round of meetings. Participants who attended round one meetings and participated in previous exercises were not required to participate again. Below are descriptions of the new exercises.

### Station. Guiding Philosophies

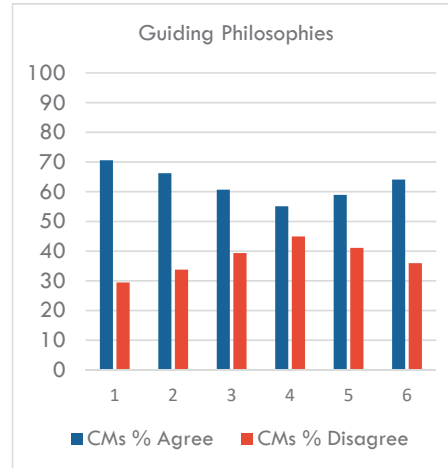
In this exercise, participants were shown a list of six guiding philosophies that were developed from conversations with county staff and the Planning Advisory Committee. They were then asked to vote on whether they agreed or disagreed with each Guiding Philosophy as written. If participants had any additional comments related to the guiding philosophies, they were asked to write them on comment forms provided. **Table 7** provides a list of the guiding philosophies, and **Figure 8** shows how the guiding philosophies were received by attendees.

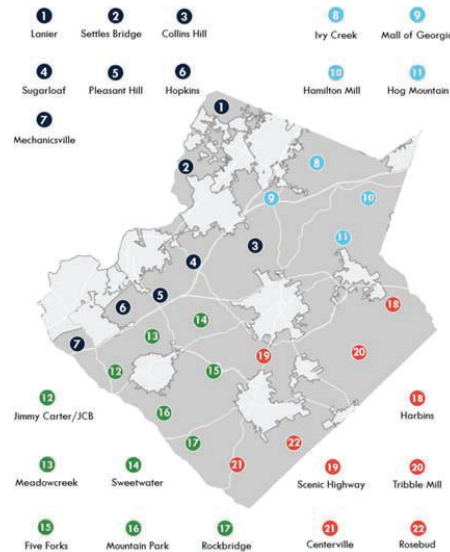
## Station. Community Assets – Names

In this exercise, participants were provided a map of the county with 22 unincorporated areas of the county. For each area, several names were shown, many of which relate to historic town centers, points of interest, and other attractions. Participants were asked to vote on which names they believed were most relevant to each area or add additional names where appropriate. Overall, the purpose of this exercise was to develop a better understanding of unincorporated areas of Gwinnett County. **Figure 9** below shows the names of each unincorporated area that received the highest number of votes.

All the community meetings were held in an “open house” format, where attendees were encouraged to come by at their leisure. No formal presentations were given at the community open houses. Below is a description of the four stations of information presented during the third round of community meetings. Scans of the boards shown are included in **Appendix C**.

### Station 1. Overview/Research & Trends

This station provided attendees with general information regarding the plan. This information included a timeline of the plan as well as demographic and historical information of the County.

### Station 2. Our Vision

This station presented information related to the plan’s vision, particularly the results of several exercises conducted during the first two rounds of open houses. The top needs and opportunities, and popular results from the online survey were shown, as well as the Unified Plan’s updated “Five Themes”

### Station 3. Plan Development

This station included information related to the several elements addressed in the Unified Plan, particularly Economic Development, Housing, and Transportation. Recommendations from several related county initiatives (i.e. Connect Gwinnett Transit Plan, Gwinnett Trails Master Plan) were shown, in addition to the results of the Opportunity for Change analyses and a draft version of the Future Development Map (FDM).

## **Station 4. Implementation**

This station provided a breakdown of the character areas in the updated Future Development Map. The information included descriptions for each character area as well as examples of potential building types, street sections, and park spaces associated with the character areas. The county's updated Short-Term Work Program was also shown.

## **Next Steps**

Following the third round of meetings, the draft plan will be finalized by the project team and submitted to both the County and Board of Commissioners for subsequent transmittal to the Georgia Department of Community Affairs. A final public hearing regarding the unified plan is scheduled for October 26<sup>th</sup>, 2018.

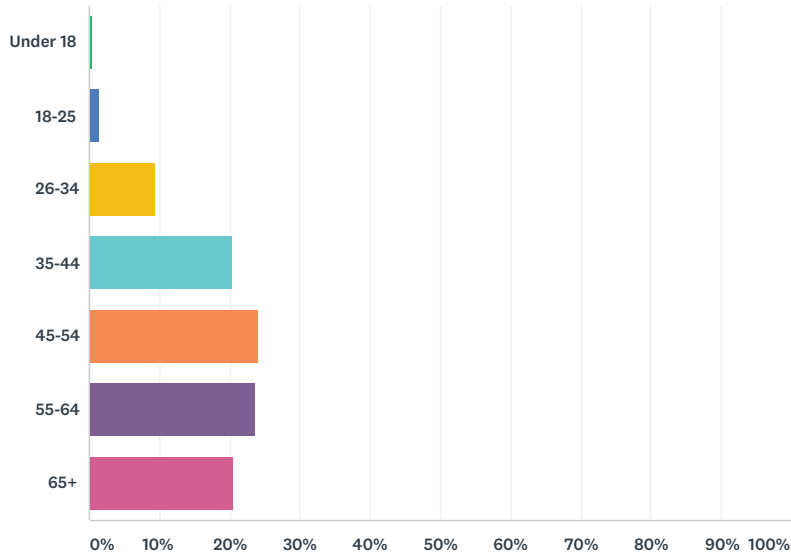

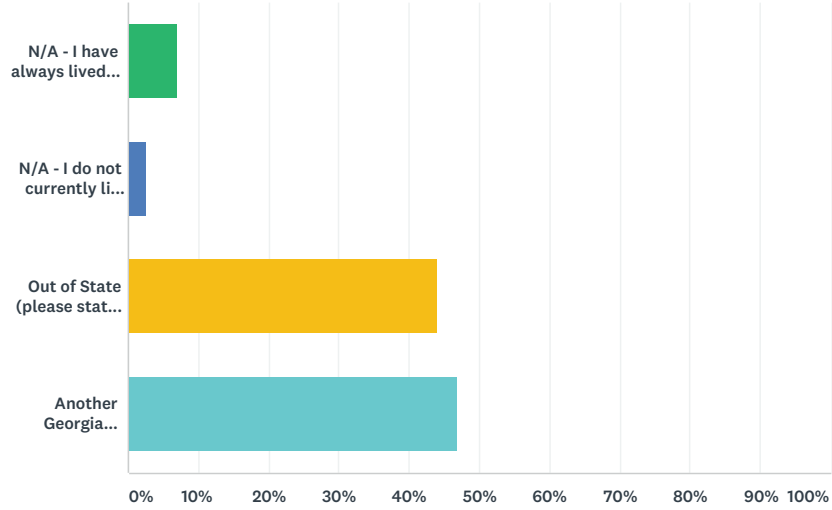

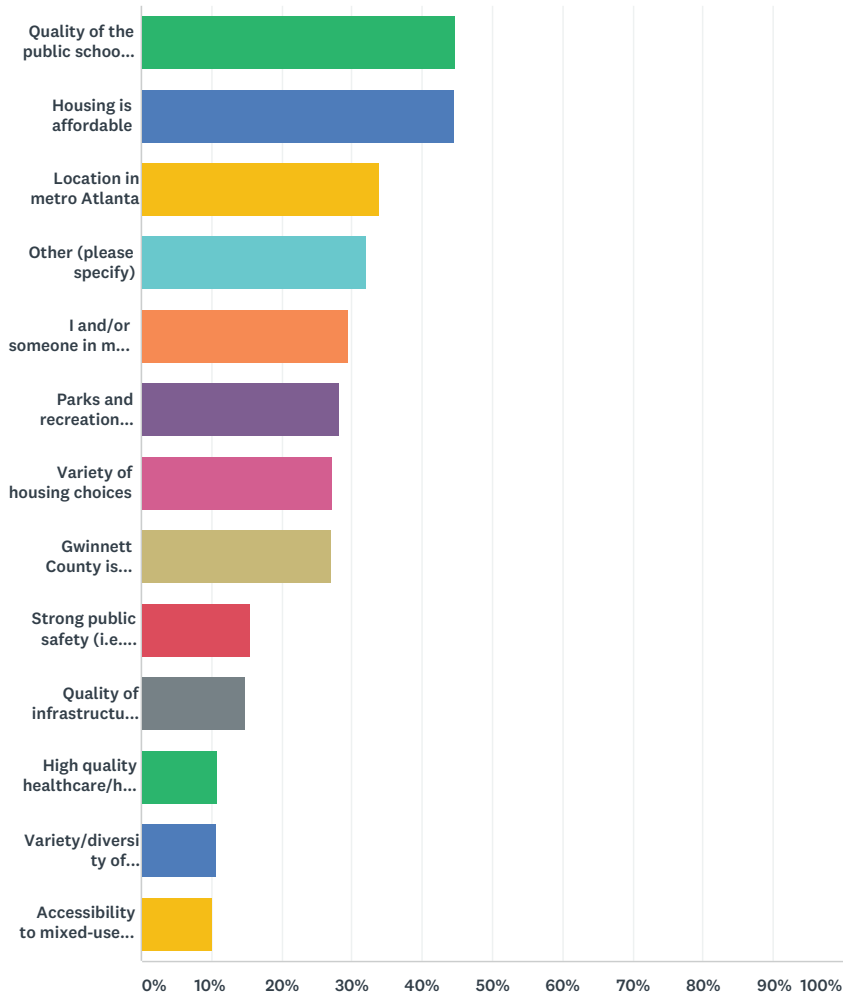

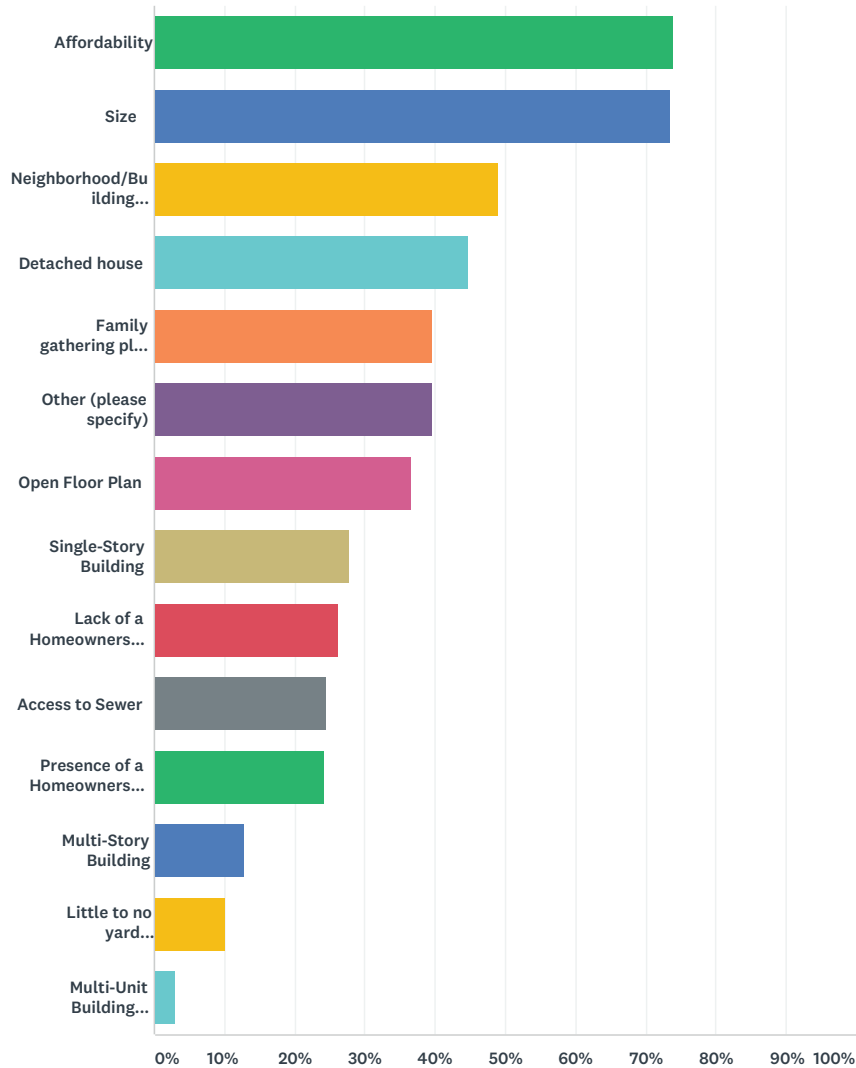

## Sphere of Influence Map



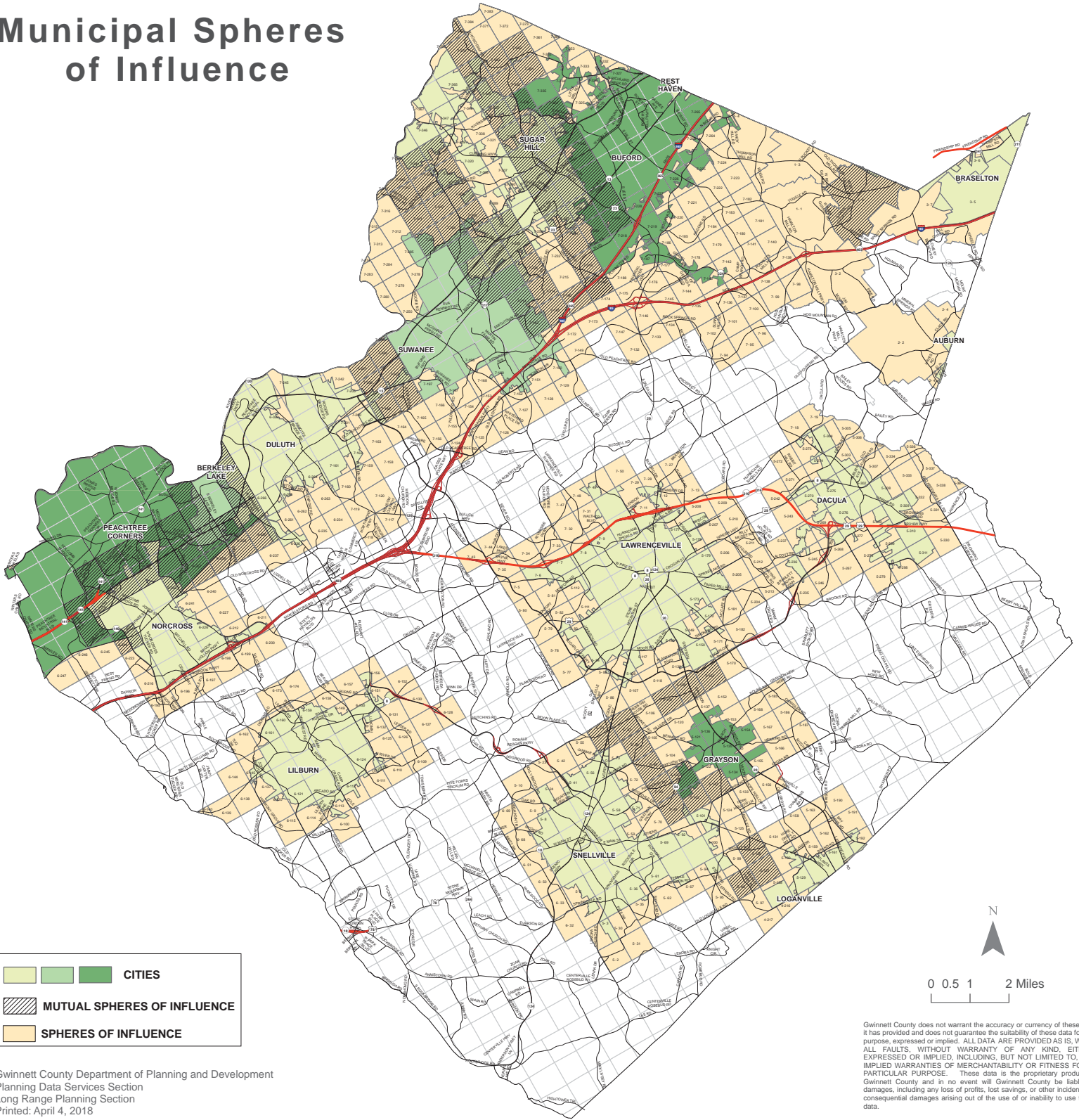


## **Sphere of Influence Map and Policies**

The Sphere Of Influence Map (SOI) enables cities within Gwinnett County to have input into zoning actions. The policies which accompany the SOI map on the preceding page. Three policies of Intergovernmental Coordination were adopted as part of the approval of the Gwinnett County 2020 Comprehensive Plan, on October 28, 1997. Adoption of the 2030 and 2040 Unified Plan continues those policies.

- The county will notify any municipality of any upcoming zoning cases within a defined sphere of municipal influence. A map showing the boundaries of the sphere of influence (SOI) of each municipality will be maintained at the office of the Gwinnett County Department of Planning & Development. The boundaries of the spheres may include any areas outside of the city boundaries that its officials feel may influence the quality of life of its citizens.
- As per Section 1-5028 of the *Gwinnett County Code*, each municipality is allowed to send one representative to the Municipal-Gwinnett County Planning Commission to vote on any land use issue that impacts their jurisdiction. The municipality may also send an official representative to the Planning Commission public hearing to speak on the case, in accordance with the *Planning Commission By-Laws*.
- Seek and maintain the participation of municipal, regional, and state agencies in the preparation of comprehensive plan elements. The Gwinnett County Department of Planning & Development will sponsor and seek active participation from other government agencies in the Gwinnett County Planning Committee (GPC). The GPC will meet on a regularly scheduled basis to discuss land use, environmental, and public service issues of mutual concern.

## Gwinnett COCS Narrative – June 2018

A cost of service study provides a snapshot of the fiscal impacts of land uses on local government budgets by reorganizing a city or county budget so that we can track all revenues and expenditures by which land use category they come from or go to. For Gwinnett County, we track three land use categories: residential, commercial, and farm/forest/undeveloped. To allocate revenue by land use category is a simple exercise in tracking where the money came from; to allocate expenditures by land use category is more complicated. The expenditure allocation is determined based on subject matter expertise from county staff on how the cost of services provided is divided between land uses.

The important results to focus on are for the General Fund and the all operating funds. These are the ones that show most clearly the impact of land use decisions made by a county and are the most important for planning purposes. After all, the bottom line for the county budget is really represented by the combination of all operating funds.

What the results show is that the county loses some money on residential development on an average, countywide basis and makes money on commercial land uses. (For simplicity, we are ignoring the farm/forest land results as they really have no impact on the county budget.)

On an all operating funds basis, residential land uses cost the county \$1.20 in service expenditures for every \$1 of revenue it pays in. In contrast, commercial land use pays in \$1 in revenue while receiving only \$0.65 back in service expenditures. These results are pretty normal for a county government and show the importance of balancing residential and commercial growth. If enough commercial development is not added to offset any shortfall from residential development, the county must either cut the budget or raise the millage rate. The rate at which residential and commercial development can balance each other's fiscal impacts are shown in the report results for a variety of representative house values.

It is important to note that the above discussion is based on county averages. While the county loses money on residential development *on average*, it does not lose money on every house, apartment, or condo in the county. As a unit's property value rises, the revenue it pays in rises; further, as the parcel size shrinks, the expenditures to provide that unit with services fall. Thus, either higher density development or higher-valued development can easily provide a fiscal surplus instead of a fiscal shortfall. The study allows us to compute the assessed value at which the county breaks even, given average density. This value is about \$305,800. That means that new houses worth more than that can be built with no risk of imposing a tax increase on existing residents, even without offsetting commercial development.

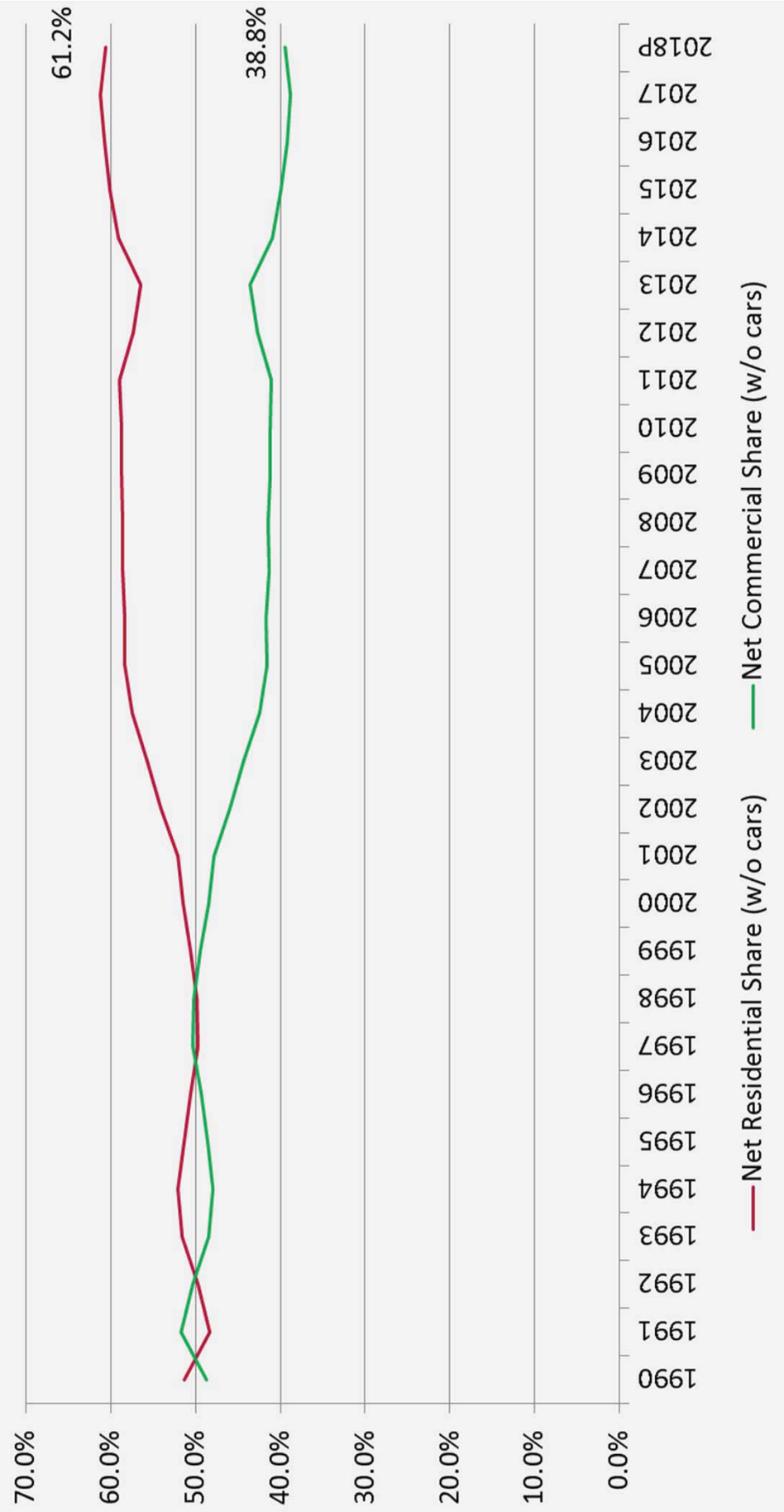

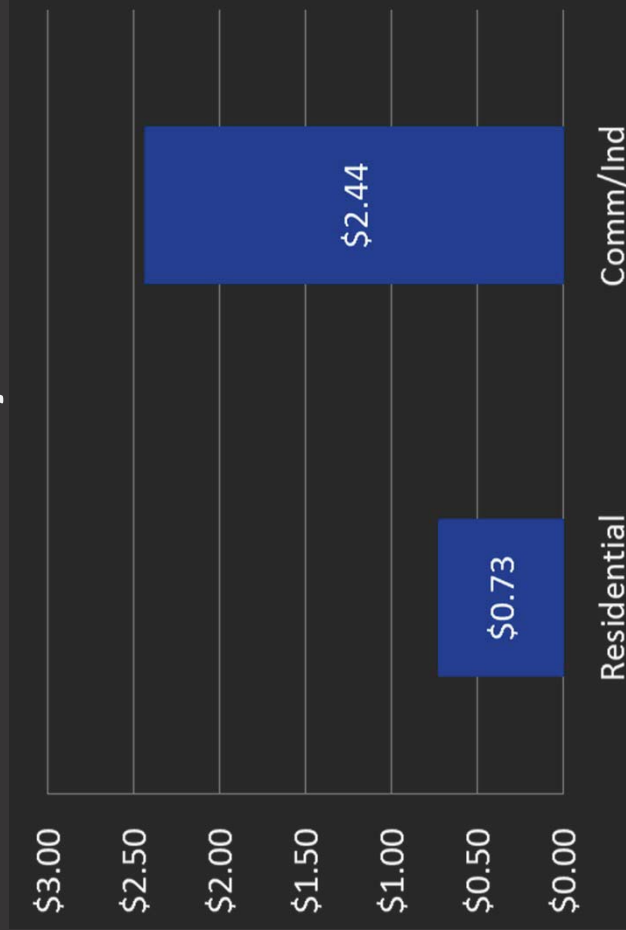
# Total Net Digest Split, 1990 - 2018

## Commercial vs. Residential

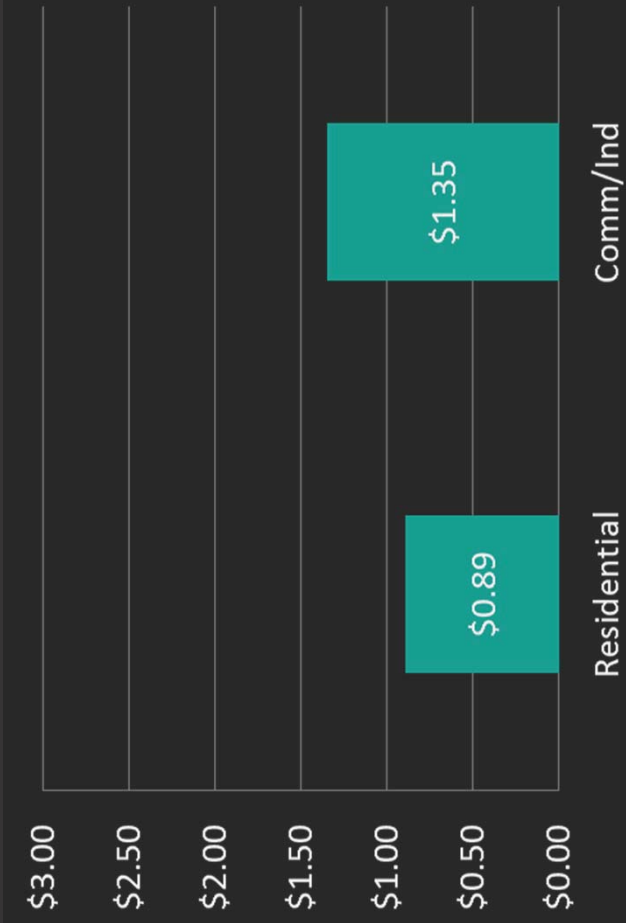
