

## HART COUNTY WATER SERVICE DELIVERY STRATEGY

Hart County has a state-authorized water and sewer authority that has a mission of providing water and sewer services to the unincorporated sections of Hart County. The Hart County Water and Sewer Utility Authority currently does not have a water treatment plant so treated water is purchased from the cities of Hartwell, Lavonia and Royston.

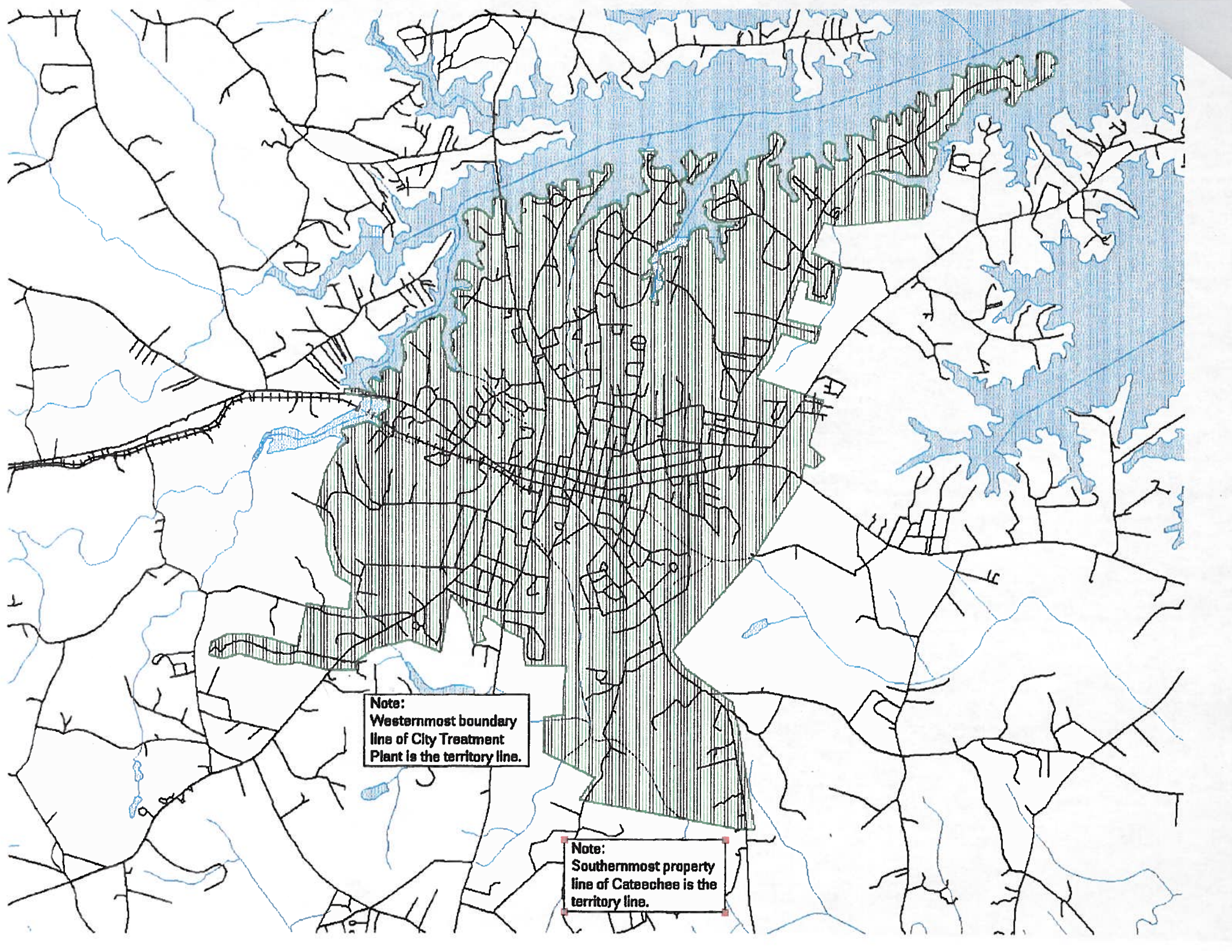
The City of Hartwell provides water service to its residents and residents of unincorporated east-central Hart County as shown on the attached maps. The City of Royston, a portion of which lies in Hart County, provides water service to its residents and residents of unincorporated southwestern Hart County as shown on the attached maps. Although not located in Hart County, the City of Lavonia provides water service to customers in the northern section of the County as shown on the attached maps. The City of Bowersville provides water service to its residents and residents of unincorporated western Hart County as shown on the attached maps. The City of Canon, a portion of which lies in Hart County, provides water service to its residents and residents of unincorporated western Hart County as shown on the attached maps. The Hart County Water and Sewer Utility Authority provides water service to residents of unincorporated Hart County as shown on the attached maps.

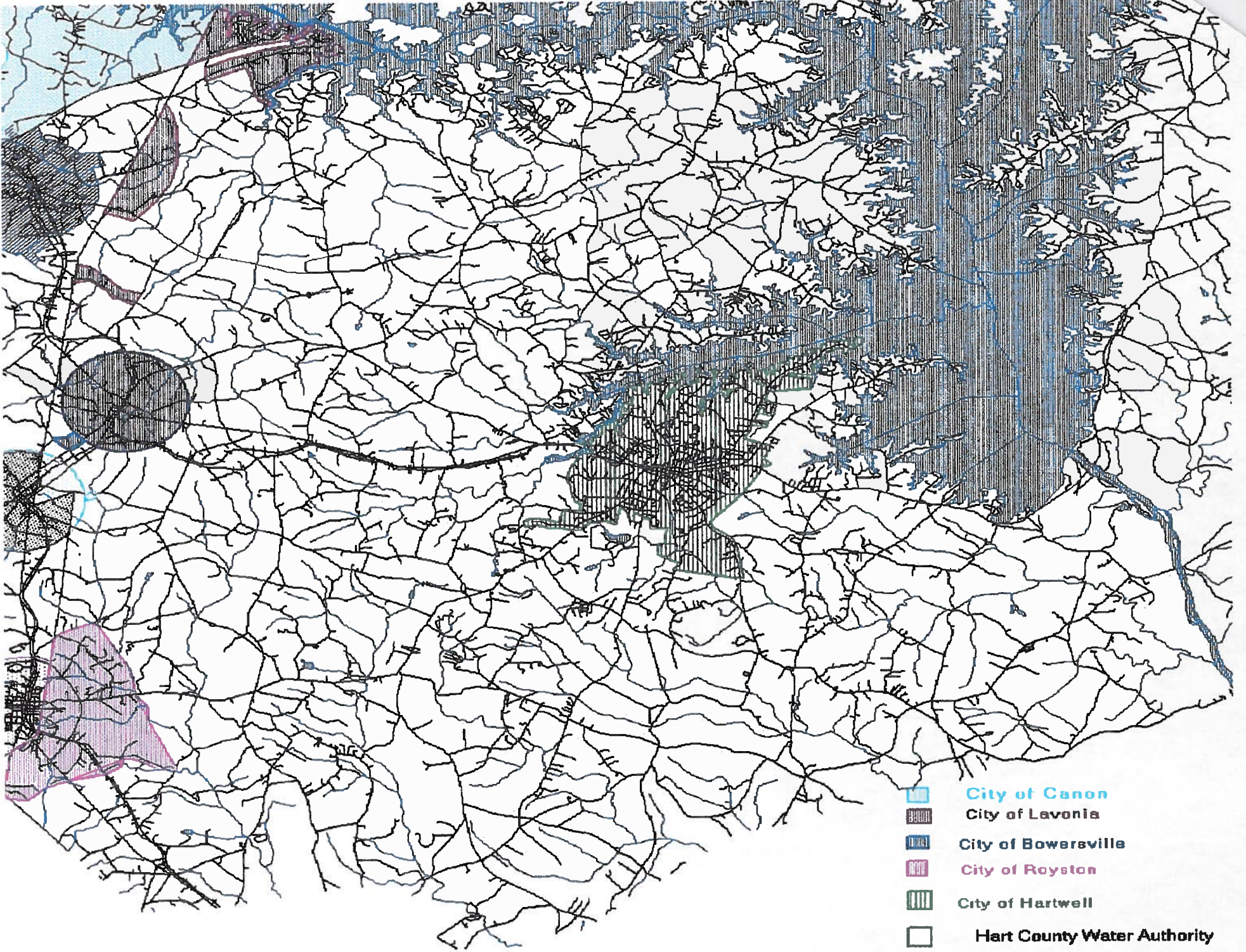
