Key Finding:

• Between 1990 and 2008, Dodge County's unemployment rates were consistently higher than that of Georgia for each year. The County's rate fluctuated from a high of 10.5% in November, 2009 to a low of 4.7% in 2000.

#### **Economic Resources and Trends**

Dodge County's lead economic development agencies are the Eastman-Dodge County Chamber of Commerce, the Dodge County-Eastman Development Authority, the Joint Development Authority of Bleckley and Dodge County, the Ocmulgee Regional Joint Development Authority (Bleckley, Dodge, Telfair, and Wilcox counties), the Heart of Georgia Regional Airport Authority (County, Eastman, and State appointees), the Middle Georgia College Aviation Campus, and the Dodge County Hospital Authority. The county's economic development assets include the Eastman-Dodge County Industrial Park (with a spec building and partially served with water, sewer, electricity, and natural gas); the Heart of Georgia Regional Airport with the Middle Georgia College Aviation Campus and a planned airport industrial park; major federal and state highways; north-south rail service through the county with daily switching services in Eastman and rail spurs to industrial sites; accessible and available plant sites; excellent utilities, including telecommunications; and skilled labor. There is also community-wide support, including a "Forward Dodge" group of public and private leaders organized through the Eastman-Dodge Chamber working on future visioning and general community improvement. In addition, there is 100% Freeport exemption on various items countywide. Dodge County is a Tier One county as classified by the OneGeorgia Authority, making qualified industries locating to the county eligible for tax credits of up to \$4,000/job created.

Good education and training opportunities are available locally to improve skill levels of the local labor force at the Middle Georgia College Aviation Campus and through Mercer University's Eastman Center. They are also provided nearby at the Dublin Center (which offers courses through East Georgia College, Middle Georgia College, and Georgia Southern University), Heart of Georgia Technical College in Dublin (which also offers Quick Start training to industries), and other nearby secondary institutions, such as Middle Georgia College, Brewton-Parker College, Georgia Southern, Georgia College & State University, and Mercer University. Workforce Investment Act program services are available through the local One-Stop Center in Eastman. Ongoing economic trends locally within the last decade include the continuing development of the County's industrial park and sites; continuing highway transportation improvements, including U.S. 341 widening and the Eastman Bypass; the establishment of the Middle Georgia College Aviation Campus at Heart of Georgia Regional Airport and continuing expansion of its facilities and services; loss of manufacturing jobs (although 1,000 remain and some companies are expanding); the emergence of service jobs as a leading source of employment; the continued growth in new retail and commercial development (Walmart Supercenter, et.al.) in Eastman; the continued expansion of medical facilities and services; the ongoing continuation of local festivals and celebrations; recreation facility upgrades countywide and at Dodge County Public Fishing Area as a means of visitor attraction; and the sustained viability of state and local government jobs as a leading source of local employment and earnings.

### NATURAL AND CULTURAL RESOURCES

Dodge County is rich in natural and cultural (historic and prehistoric) resources. (See selected NCR maps which follow.) Its significant wetlands, groundwater recharge areas, and the Ocmulgee River Protected Corridor are addressed through a local environmental conservation ordinance as required by DNR's Part 5 Environmental Planning Criteria, which all county jurisdictions adopted in 1999. Dodge County and its municipalities utilize groundwater supplied primarily by the Floridan Aquifer.

Agriculture (21.6 percent) and forestry (67.4 percent) are by far the county's major land uses, estimated at a total of approximately 89 percent based on the information collected during this plan's preparation. Roughly 70 percent of Dodge County soils (Tifton-Fuquay-Dothan Association) are considered prime farmland. Dodge County ranks 55<sup>th</sup> in Georgia for its reported value of agricultural production, with row/forage crops as the top commodity followed by forestry and related products, then vegetables, poultry/eggs, livestock/aquaculture, and ornamental horticulture. The county ranks second in Georgia for both rye and straw production; sixth for oats and cucumbers; eighth for turfgrass; ninth for watermelon; tenth for squash; 11<sup>th</sup> for cantaloupe; 12<sup>th</sup> for bell peppers, squash, and sweet corn; and 13<sup>th</sup> for peaches. Dodge County is fifth in the state for total forestry and related products, second for pine straw, and 27<sup>th</sup> for timber. The county also ranks 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> respectively, for its beef stocker and beef cow production.

One animal and six (6) plants identified in Dodge County are currently listed on DNR's list of Special Concern Animals and Plants. None have federal protected status; however, four (4) plants (the yellow flytrap, hooded pitcherplant, Pineland Barbara buttons, sandhill milkvetch) have Georgia protected status.

Dodge County has one state recreation area, the Dodge County Public Fishing Area, and public landings on the Ocmulgee (Dodge County and McCranie). There are also local and

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regional parks, such as Eastman-Dodge County Recreation Park. The private, historic Jaybird Springs resort near Chauncey is currently closed. Most of the county's scenic areas are associated with its natural resources and areas, such as the Ocmulgee River and the previously mentioned recreation areas.

The Dodge County Courthouse, Eastman Bus Station, Eastman House, and Peabody School (all in Eastman) and the Williamson Mausoleum at Orphans Cemetery (in the county near Eastman) are currently listed in the National Register of Historic Places. There are other eligible properties, including downtown Eastman and Milan; Chauncey and Chester schools; residential historic districts in Eastman; and much of Rhine, that have not yet been listed. The former Dodge County Jail was named to Georgia's Top 10 Places of Peril list for 2010 by the Georgia Trust for Historic Preservation. There are also numerous archaeological sites county-wide presently recorded in the UGA State Archaeological Site File. A county-wide historic resources survey was completed in 1977 which documented approximately 232 historic properties; however, many more are now considered historic (at least 50 years old).

As Dodge County continues to grow, protection of its natural and cultural resources and the county's rural character is needed to maintain the community's overall quality of life now and in the future. This can best be achieved through controlled and planned growth and land use regulation designed to conserve these significant resources and encourage their sensitive development for compatible economic development, recreation, and tourism uses, as appropriate.

# **COMMUNITY FACILITIES AND SERVICES**

### **Transportation**

Dodge County and its municipalities have a good transportation system consisting of county roads, city streets, state highways (GA 27, GA 30, GA 46, GA 87, GA 117, GA 126, GA 165 and GA 230) and federal highways (U.S. 23, U.S. 257, U.S. 280, U.S. 319, U.S. 341, and U.S. 441). Completion of several major road widening projects, including U.S. 23 (provides access to Macon and areas to the north) and U.S. 280 (east/west route from Savannah to Columbus), are important transportation priorities for the Dodge County community. In addition, improvements are needed to GA 117, as well as multi-laning GA 46, at least to the airport. Oneway pairing of Oak and College streets in Eastman to tie in with U.S. 23 is also desired, but appears to have been put on hold for the immediate future. The U.S. 341 Bypass south of Eastman was completed in the last several years. Eastman and Milan have been awarded DOT Transportation Enhancement funds to assist with downtown streetscape improvements and historic transportation building rehabilitations (Eastman Bus Station and Milan Depot). The Heart of Georgia Regional Airport is owned by the Heart of Georgia Regional Airport Authority. It is a Level III facility with a relatively new terminal owned and operated by Middle Georgia College for its Aviation Program campus. CSX and Norfolk Southern railroads serve Dodge County. There is a continuing need for paving dirt and connector roads, as well as resurfacing others.

### Water Supply and Treatment

All five municipalities in Dodge County have public water systems. Water line extensions and upgrades may be needed within some jurisdictions and in any adjacent growth areas to help facilitate further growth, as needed. Residents of unincorporated Dodge County, who do not obtain water from a nearby municipal system, rely mainly on individual private wells which tap into the Floridan or shallow aquifers. The county's municipalities draw water from the Floridan Aquifer. Chauncey needs to upgrade its water system, including new lines, tank, and well. While the Town of Chester's present water system is adequate, it would need to be expanded to accommodate future growth of Dodge State Prison. Eastman refurbished all of its water storage tanks in 2006/2007, but the City still needs a maintenance plan for them. Milan has been awarded a CDBG grant to replace existing small diameter water lines, add fire hydrants, and pave roads in the Pine Acres Drive area in the northeast part of the city. The City of Rhine also needs to replace existing small lines due to flow issues, and its water tank needs interior cleaning/maintenance. Rhine charges a flat water rate and has no meters, but may need to obtain meters in the future. There are continuing needs to serve expected growth areas county-wide.

## Sewerage System and Wastewater Treatment

Chester, Eastman, and Milan are presently the only Dodge County jurisdictions that have sewerage systems. Currently, residents of Chauncey, Rhine, and unincorporated Dodge County, who are not hooked onto sewer service in an adjacent community, must rely on septic tank systems. Those communities with existing systems may need to add lines to serve future growth within their jurisdiction and/or extend/expand service in the future to accommodate growth in adjacent growth areas. Future prison expansion in Chester and/or Milan would likely require upgrades to existing sewerage systems. Eastman closed its James Avenue wastewater treatment plant in 2009 and doubled capacity at the Sugar Creek Plant. The City is currently renovating the Legion Drive lift station, while others need upgrading and some lines need repair or replacement. Further upgrades and extensions will be needed to accommodate expected growth in the future. Rhine is presently seeking USDA Rural Development funds to provide public sewer service and expects to receive approval later in 2010. Chauncey is not pursuing public provision of such service at this time. There will be needs to provide upgrades and extensions to accommodate expected growth within Dodge County and its municipalities.

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### **Solid Waste**

Dodge County utilizes the Houston County Subtitle D Municipal Solid Waste Landfill, which has an estimated remaining capacity of 9.88 years in its current cells and room for future expansion. The County has a transfer station and convenience centers in Chester and Rhine. It is currently trying to phase out green boxes. Chauncey currently has a green box. Milan takes its solid waste to the Telfair County Municipal Solid Waste Landfill, which has a capacity to operate for approximately 11 more years. Limited recycling programs currently exist in Dodge County. The recently revised Dodge County Solid Waste Management Plan provides more detailed information concerning all aspects of the community's solid waste and related program issues.

## **Public Safety**

#### Law Enforcement

There are five local law enforcement agencies within Dodge County, which work cooperatively to protect and serve the citizens and the community. Chauncey has one full-time officer and may need an additional one. A car equipped with modern equipment is needed, along with a taser, protective vest, and uniforms. A night watchman is employed in Chester. The Eastman Police Department has a marked vehicle for each of its officers, several of which are new, but they need additional vehicles to replace those older ones in constant need of repair. More modern safety and communications equipment is also needed as well as additional officers. Milan has a police officer who works full-time (mostly at night), but funding is desired for a 24 hour patrol and a backup car. Rhine's police department needs updated vehicles and equipment. The Dodge County Sheriff's Department is responsible for patrolling the unincorporated areas of the county and providing back-up to the smaller cities. A new county jail is under construction at the Eastman-Dodge County Industrial Park. The new 166-bed facility is expected to be complete by 2011.

#### Fire Protection/EMS/EMA

There are nine organized volunteer fire departments located throughout Dodge County which primarily serve the unincorporated county and its smaller municipalities. The Rockwell Station outside Milan was built in 2009 and is adequate to house its one truck. The Milan Volunteer Fire Department has applied to FEMA for a gym and classroom addition and will need another fire truck within the next five to ten years. When the former prison at Milan closed, the community lost the additional fire protection provided by the prison fire department. The City has requested that the Georgia Department of Corrections provide another fire unit and truck from the Telfair State Prison to assist when needed. Milan's ISO rating of 5 compares favorably to much of Dodge County and its smaller cities, many of which are rated at 9. Also with an ISO rating of 5, the City of Eastman has the only paid firefighters in the county. They are divided between two fire stations located on 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Main Street (behind City Hall). Although volunteer firefighters supplement the full-time paid staff, additional full-time firefighters are needed to lessen the dependency on volunteers. A new pumper is also needed to replace a 1985 1000 gpm model. Dodge County assumed management and operation of the EMS from the Dodge County Hospital in 2007. The EMS remains located at the hospital; however, a separate facility will be needed sometime in the future. The EMS recently acquired a new ambulance. Vehicle, equipment, and staffing upgrades will be needed in the future to accommodate the growing community. The Dodge County EMA is housed in the historic former jail, which is in need of major rehabilitation for continuous use in any capacity. The County needs a new Emergency Operations Center. The E-911 Program serves both Dodge and Wilcox counties. Its old existing facility in Eastman needs to be replaced and equipment updated as needed.

### **Hospital and Other Public Health Facilities**

The Dodge County Hospital Authority operates the 94 bed Dodge County Hospital in Eastman. Continued upgrades and service improvements have been made to the hospital since its original construction in 1963. It is currently in the process of opening a tele-health system which will provide interactive video communication between physicians at Dodge County Hospital and specialists at the Medical Center of Central Georgia. The hospital is currently recruiting doctors in several different specialties. Upgrade or replacement is needed to equipment, furnishings, HVAC system, roof, parking and patient rooms. The Dodge County Health Department provides public health services to the citizens of Dodge County. The clinic provided 2,517 services to County residents in 2009. There are two nursing homes in Dodge County with a total of 200 beds and seven (7) licensed personal care homes with a total of 82 beds. A new regional community mental health center is under construction.

## Recreation

Recreation facilities in Dodge County are operated by the Eastman-Dodge Recreation Department Board and funded by the County and through user fees. The Eastman-Dodge County Recreation Park is located north of Eastman on GA 117. It is a large facility consisting of five (5) ballfields, one (1) multi-purpose field, paved walking track, gymnasium, and playgrounds. More than 2,000 youth and adults utilize the facility annually. Upgrades and renovations have been ongoing, as funds permit, to provide residents with adequate recreation facilities. The smaller communities each have local recreation facilities that they operate. Chauncey has a gym and ballfield, both of which need upgrading, including the addition of lights at the ballfield. A walking track is also desired. Chester has a ballfield/park, while Milan also has a ballfield. Milan's single ballfield is located on U.S. 280. The City wants to build a two (2) field facility with a walking track and concession stand at a new, safer location. Rhine is seeking upgrades to its ballfield and construction of a walking trail. It also has a historic gymnasium, which is in need of work as its current condition makes it a liability for the City.

## **General Government**

The six governments of Dodge County work to ensure that the needs of their citizens are met. Each government offers services and maintains public facilities, which enhance the quality of life for their citizens. Necessary maintenance and upgrades to public facilities and infrastructure are conducted on an as needed basis and as funds are available. A new government complex for the City of Eastman is needed to replace its aging city hall and to possibly consolidate City services in one location. Milan is interested in obtaining a Community Center, while Rhine needs to renovate its existing city hall or possibly relocate to another existing or new structure. Rhine's Community Center also needs to be upgraded. The County needs additional administrative office space. The Old Dodge County Jail is a County-owned historic treasure in need of rehabilitation.

### **Educational Facilities**

Dodge County's school system has five (5) schools operated by the Dodge County Board of Education. All are located in or near Eastman, including the pre-school, two elementary schools, middle and high schools. A total of 3,335 students were enrolled for the 2009-2010 school year. The new Dodge County High School was completed in late 2005. The facilities are in good condition, due to frequent equipment upgrades, maintenance, and service improvements. Both elementary schools (North and South Dodge) are currently adding more classrooms to accommodate their students. Several higher educational opportunities are available in Dodge County. Middle Georgia College's Aviation Campus in Eastman is emerging as a leader in aviation education and instruction in the Southeast. Mercer University also offers onsite undergraduate college courses at the Ocmulgee Regional library's Public Services Annex facility in Eastman.

### Library and Other Cultural Facilities

The Dodge County-Murrell Memorial Library in Eastman serves as the headquarters for the Ocmulgee Regional Library System. The Dodge County Library has approximately 7,500 cardholders and about 50,000 volumes. While the library's facility is currently in good shape due to regular repairs and maintenance as needed, there is a need for another staff librarian and additional books. Located adjacent to the Dodge County Library is the Public Annex which can seat 125 and has a lab with 18 computers. Mercer University offers classes there in the evening, while the facility can be used during the day by various agencies and businesses for workshops, meetings, and similar uses. The new Eastman-Dodge Regional Visitors Information Center is expected to open during the Summer of 2010. An officially designated Georgia State Welcome Center, the facility is located at 1646 College Street at the intersection with the U.S. 341/Eastman Bypass. Construction of an adjacent civic center designed to accommodate meetings and events of various sizes has been halted until additional funds are available to complete it. The Eastman House in Eastman is a historic house and local history museum. Downtown Eastman's historic Magnolia Theatre is used for community events and social gatherings. The historic Eastman Bus Station, located near downtown, has rehabilitation potential for community use. The City of Eastman owns the property and has been awarded grant funds to assist with renovations. The privately owned Eastman Depot is another downtown historic landmark which has tremendous adaptive use potential and is in need of renovation. The second floor of the historic Chauncey School (now the City Hall) still retains its original auditorium, which also needs renovation. The City of Milan has been awarded DOT Transportation Enhancement funds to rehabilitate its historic depot as a museum.

## **Intergovernmental Coordination**

Dodge County recognizes the value of intergovernmental coordination on the local, regional, and state levels with respect to coordinated planning/growth management, services sharing/cooperation/consolidation/joint delivery, economic development, and other areas. Dodge County and the City of Eastman have a particularly close relationship, working together for the betterment of the broader community on the joint Dodge County-Eastman Development Authority, Eastman-Dodge Recreation Department Board, and together with the state on the Heart of Georgia Regional Airport Authority. The County also coordinates economic development efforts with Bleckley County through a joint development authority and on a regional basis with Telfair, Wilcox, and Bleckley counties as the Ocmulgee Regional Joint Development Authority. In addition, Dodge and Wilcox counties have a joint E-911 program. The County and its municipalities further utilize solid waste disposal facilities in other counties (Houston and Telfair). Dodge County and its cities also participate regionally in the 17-county Heart of Georgia Altamaha RC. Continued mutual cooperation among Dodge County's jurisdictions, neighboring governments, the region, and state will be of major importance in the future as governments strive to do more with less and seek joint solutions for common problems. Dodge County and its municipalities offer a wide variety of public facilities and infrastructure that are compatible with the steady growth of the community. Continuous upgrades and maintenance of the current facilities and improvements to services offered to the citizens of Dodge County have aided in the efforts to support this growth and improve the local quality of life.

## **Consistency with Service Delivery Strategy**

Dodge County and its municipalities remain consistent with their Service Delivery Strategy in their provision of services and service areas as outlined in their current agreement signed by all jurisdictions in 1999. Any desired changes to the present Service Delivery Strategy will be negotiated between or among the local governments impacted in conjunction with a review of the entire Service Delivery Strategy as required as part of the full comprehensive plan update. Because service provision is relatively clearly divided between governments of Dodge County and intergovernmental cooperation and coordination is strong, no conflicts or inconsistency with the comprehensive plan are known or anticipated.
