## **FIRE PROTECTION SERVICES**

### **Continuing Arrangement**

Randolph County is served by a volunteer fire department which includes 17 volunteers and seven trucks that are equipped with fire fighting capabilities. According to records, the county's rural area will average 7.5 house fires and 30 grass fires per year. Approximately 75 percent occur at night.

Fire insurance rating for the rural area are an ISO of 10.

City of Coleman Volunteer Fire Department has 12-16 certified volunteers, all of whom work outside the city during the day. The city has 21 three-way fire hydrants and two fire trucks - one provided by the county, one a city truck. The ISO rating for Coleman is an eight.

City of Cuthbert has a full-time professional fire department with six employees. The fire station is located on U.S. 27 south of the Town Square. The Cuthbert Fire Department serves the entire city plus an additional five mile radius outside the city limits. The city has an ISO rating of seven in the city and nine in the five mile radius.

City of Shellman Fire Department is a volunteer fire department which includes 11 certified volunteers. The volunteer fire departments has two trucks and an ISO rating of eight.

The municipal fire services provide a higher level of services in terms of response time and ISO ratings than the county provided services. Thus there is no duplication of same level services. Each fire department cooperates and backs up each other in crises situations.

City of Shellman Fire Department is a volunteer fire department which includes 11 certified volunteers. The volunteer fire department has two trucks and an ISO rating of eight.

## **JAILS SERVICE**

### **Continuing Arrangement**

Randolph County Sheriff's Department operates a county jail built in 1964 adjacent to the Cuthbert City Hall/Jail. It has a capacity of 32 male prisoner beds, all in multi-occupancy cells. Women prisoners are not housed in the county jail, but are housed across the street in the Cuthbert jail which is properly manned for female prisoners. An average of 20 prisoners per day are housed in the Randolph County Jail. The jail does not comply with ACA or Georgia Jail Standards in six areas.

City of Cuthbert Jail has three cells and is equipped to handle twelve prisoners, both male and female. The average number of prisoners per day is 3.5. This jail serves as the regional depository for women prisoners for surrounding counties on a fee per day basis.

City of Shellman has a police force, but houses its male prisoners in Randolph County Jail. Shellman's prisoners average 30 per year. Female prisoners are housed in the City of Cuthbert Jail.

The two jails in Randolph County do not duplicate, but complement each other, particularly with female prisoners accommodation. Thus, for several elements, Cuthbert Jail offers higher levels of service than Randolph County Jail.



## **LAW ENFORCEMENT**

### **Continuing Arrangement**

Randolph County Sheriff's Office provides law enforcement services for the portion of the county outside the municipalities of Cuthbert and Shellman. The Sheriff's Department consists of the Sheriff, five full-time deputies, four jailers, one secretary, and one cook. The department has seven patrol cars. The office is open to calls on a 24-hour basis for dispatching services.

Cuthbert Police Department personnel consists of ten full-time and the part-time positions. This includes the Chief, five full-time police officers, three certified jailers, and one civilian dispatcher. The department has five fully-equipped patrol cars and mans a 24-hour jail. The police department only services the City of Cuthbert, but can back-up the Sheriff's Department in emergencies.

Shellman Police Department has four full-time police officers and three patrol cars, equipped with lights and radios.

The two municipal services provide higher services than the county police department in terms of patrolling patterns and service areas. There is no same level service duplication.

Randolph County operates a park located northeast of Cuthbert providing a ballfield for countywide participation. Based on DNR's Recreation Needs Report, the county has a sports complex that has sufficient existing land to handle proposed recreation expansion over the next twenty years.

Coleman City Park provides recreational services to it's residents closer than availability through the county ballfields complex.

Cuthbert has two parks. The old Day Park with one baseball/softball field, two basketball courts, one handball court and playground equipment plus two picnic shelters. The ornamental/picnicking facility across from Andrew College is planned for construction of an amphitheater facility by 1999.

Shellman has one city park located across from City Hall with walking trails and picnic facilities.

Sanitary sewage collection systems for Cuthbert and Shellman within their current boundaries are adequate to meet existing and future population needs during the next twenty years.

Areas of future population growth will require extension of Cuthbert's sanitary sewerage system to service growth areas of the U.S. 27 By-Pass (North-South), U.S. 82 by-pass (East West) and economic growth corridor between Cuthbert and Shellman. The extension of Shellman's sanitary sewerage system outside it's municipal boundaries is also projected along the U.S. 82 corridor toward Cuthbert.

There are no existing sanitary sewerage systems for Coleman or the unincorporated areas of Randolph County. There are no plans for such utilities by Coleman or Randolph County in the future. It is agreed that the sanitary sewerage - sewage treatment facilities should be provided by the City of Cuthbert and City of Shellman as needed and economically justified.
