5. That all necessary documents pertaining hereto be promptly forwarded to the Georgia Department of Community Affairs for verification pursuant to Georgia Law.





1. That the Service Delivery Strategy adopted in 1999 and duly amended in 2004 and in 2006 is hereby adopted,
