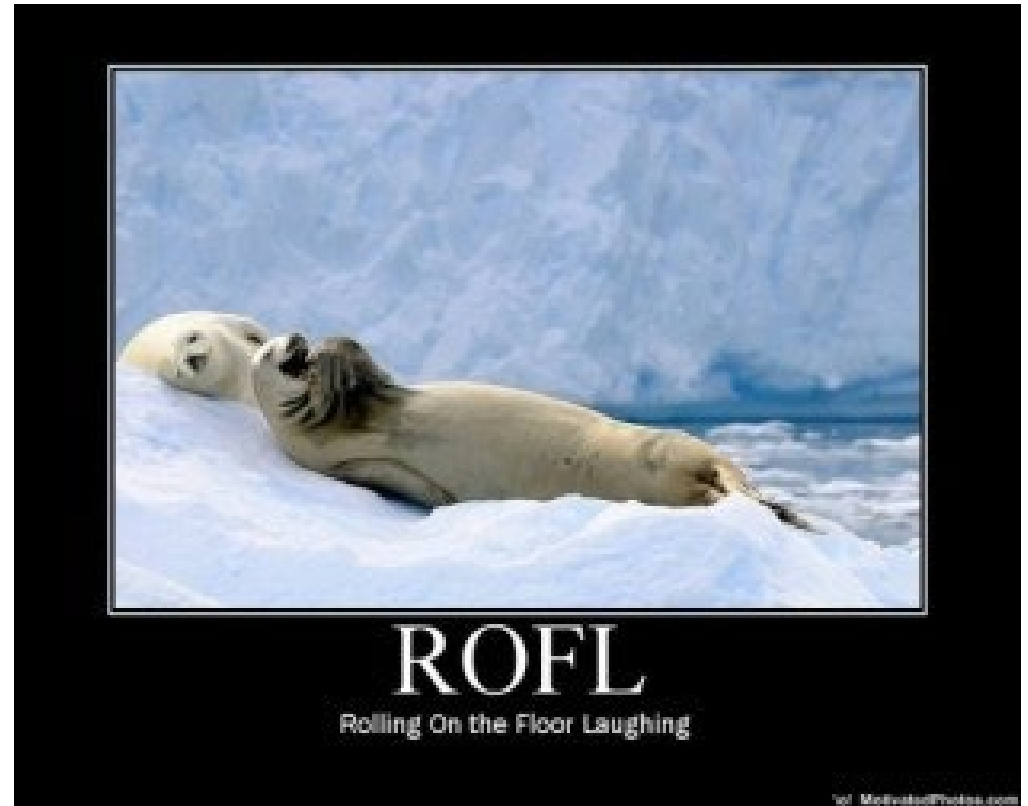

- Must have completed the last 3 years of **GOMI** **AND** the most recent 3 fiscal years for **RLGF**.
- Local governments that are non-compliant are barred from receiving state funding from DCA.
- GOMI-due on June 30th of each year.
- RLGF is completed throughout the year with a local government's due date being 6 months after the end of their fiscal year.

Search Functionality in GOMI/RLGF Compliance Dashboard

1 Searching functionality
 You can search using filters for the specific local government

3 Clicking on "region" will allow you to search by a regional commission and will return the county information along with all the cities located in that regional commission.

2 Clicking on "government" will allow you to search by name for all municipalities and counties

4 Clicking on "county located" will allow you to search by a county and will return the county information along with all the cities located in that county. In the example below with Appling County, you see the search returns both the county and the municipalities contained within the county
