It is not only the cost of installation but also the cost and frustration of numerous call-backs. Food and medications requiring refrigeration have been lost in several cases. Despite help from the National Electrical Manufacturers, this problem continues to persist. Electrical fires caused by arcing in newer homes, especially in this area, are not common occurrences. Problems far outweigh any benefits

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT OF PROPOSED AMENDMENT:

Providing exception will reduce costs and liability for Georgia builders, electricians and consumers. The amendment will remove unnecessary regulatory cost without impacting safety. Reducing unneeded costs is critically important is Georgia's goal to provide more affordable but safe homes.

#### **DESCRIPTION:**

Revise Section 210.52(A)(4) **'Countertop and Similar Work Surface Receptacle Outlets'** to read as follows:

(4) Countertop and Similar Work Surface Receptacle Outlets. Receptacles installed for countertop and similar work surfaces as specified in 210.52(C) shall not be considered as the receptacle outlets required by 210.52(A), unless installed in accessible countertops in Meeting Rooms as defined by 210.65.

#### **REASON/INTENT:**

The **NEC 2017, Section 210.65 Meeting Room** addresses electrical outlet requirements for Meeting Rooms. While this sounds like there is some flexibility in placement, The reference in 215.1 B (1) notes that the number of receptacle outlets in fixed walls to be installed in accordance with 210.52(A)(1) through (A)(4) which is a reference based on residential outlet spacing. Section 210.52 is labeled **Dwelling Unit Receptacle Outlets**. Proposed revision to 210.52(A)(4) would allow the designers to meet the receptacle count by also providing countertop and work surfaces for equipment and users based on the needs for that particular space.

FINANCIAL IMPACT OF PROPOSED AMENDMENT: This proposal will not increase costs.

DELAY IMPLEMENTATION (not mandate) until next code cycle

#### **REASON/INTENT:**

There are issues with mandating currently available surge-protection products in all cases. The new language does not specify which conductors are to be protected or what the minimum short circuit current rating, the minimum nominal discharge current rating or the voltage protection rating should be. Market pressures will dictate that the lowest level of protection is installed in most cases, severely limiting the effectiveness of the devices. There is also no guarantee that the devices remain in service, further negating any possible advantages of this new mandate. Many smaller utilities in Georgia may not provide this service. It should remain a consumer choice until more technical data is developed to show the need and the specifics of this requirement

FINANCIAL IMPACT OF PROPOSED AMENDMENT: Cost impact of \$500 to \$1500 per house. Delay will give time for more cost effective and better technical equipment. Georgia needs to prevent unnecessary and added regulatory costs to builders and consumers until more information is provided on the life safety and fire protection aspects of this requirement. It should remain consumer choice at this time. There is a crisis of workforce (affordable) housing in Georgia and throughout the country. Any new regulatory costs should be completely justified and necessary.
