Publication of Proposed NSP 3 Action Plan And Intent to File a Notice of Funding Availability

Overview of Neighborhood Stabilization Program

The purpose of the Neighborhood Stabilization Program 3 (NSP 3) is to provide additional financial assistance to areas of greatest need through local governments for areas affected or likely to be affected by foreclosed and abandoned residential properties. Local governments and/or authorized sub-recipients may use the financial assistance for the discounted purchase of abandoned and foreclosed homes while providing affordable rental and homeownership opportunities to households individually or in areas at or below 120% of Area Median Income (AMI).

In accordance with the Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD's) 10/19/2010 Federal Register Notice, the Department of Community Affairs (DCA) has expedited the development of a proposed Action Plan for distribution of approximately \$18.6 million in NSP 3 funding from HUD in accordance with the provisions of Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act.

The Department requests comments on the proposed Action Plan from all citizens; however, commentary is especially sought from local governments, potential sub-recipients, banks and realtors in the areas of "greatest need" as described within Section 2 of the proposed Action Plan and who are involved or plan to be involved in the sale of "real estate owned" residential properties in blighted neighborhoods within the 120% of AMI areas described above.

The proposed Action Plan describes the DCA's proposal to undertake its distribution of State NSP 3 funds using two methods: 1) a formula analysis of need and initial allocation to the jurisdictions of greatest need meeting threshold criteria (Direct Allocation Pool); and 2) the undertaking of direct NSP activities through the Georgia Housing and Finance Authority (Affordable Rental Housing Development). The Proposed Plan also lists details on eligible applicants, eligible sub-recipients, eligible activities, implementation periods and application protocols for both methods of distribution.

The public comment period for the proposed Action Plan will run from February 11, 2011 through February 25, 2011 at 5:00 P.M. A public hearing to discuss the proposed Plan will be held February 18, 2011 at 10:00 a.m. in DCA's central office in the 3rd floor boardroom. You may submit comments through email to nsp.sacomments@dca.ga.gov or via hand delivery to the central office or the U.S. Postal Service to DCA's central office at the address below.

Intent to File a Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA)

Local governments and potential sub-recipients eligible and interested in applying for NSP 3 funding should review the law, HUD Notice and DCA's "final proposed" Action Plan (which will be updated pursuant to public comments following the comment period) before finalizing a local plans or applications. On March 1, 2011, DCA will submit its Action Plan Amendment to HUD and simultaneously publish our NOFA. DCA anticipates that the NOFA will set the **due date for applications for the formula Direct Allocation Pool as March 31, 2011 at 5:00 p.m.**
