

Outline of Overarching Policy Priorities Highlighted in FY 2018 NOFA

1. Ending Homelessness for All Persons
 - a. Identify, engage and effectively serve all persons experiencing homelessness
 - b. Measure performance based on local data that take into account challenges faced by
 - i. Veterans
 - ii. Youth
 - iii. Families
 - iv. Chronically homeless
 - c. Comprehensive outreach strategy to identify and continuously engage all unsheltered individuals and families
 - d. Use local data to determine characteristics of individuals and families with highest needs and longest experiences of homelessness to develop housing and services tailored to their needs
 - e. Reallocation to projects that improve overall performance and better respond to needs
2. Create a Systematic Response to Ending Homelessness
 - a. Measure System Performance to determine effectiveness of programs
 - b. Create an effective Coordinated Entry process
 - c. Promote participant choice
 - d. Plan as a system
 - e. Make the delivery of homeless assistance more open, inclusive, and transparent
3. Strategic Resource Reallocation
 - a. Comprehensive Review of Projects
 - b. Maximizing the Use of Mainstream Resources
 - c. Partnerships with Public Housing Authorities and other available options for exiting PSH participants
 - d. Review of eligible renewal projects to determine effectiveness
4. Using a Housing First Approach
 - a. Prioritize rapid placement and stabilization in permanent housing
 - b. No service participation requirements or preconditions
 - c. Projects should quickly move homeless persons into permanent housing
 - d. CoCs should measure and help projects reduce length of time people experience homelessness
 - e. Engage landlords and property owners
 - f. Remove barriers to entry
 - g. Adopt client-centered service methods
